Friends, I want to take a moment to remind you that your pastor will never request money from you or ask you to purchase gift cards, whether by phone call, text message, or email. Technology has made it so that scams are becoming more and more a part of our everyday life. Recently, I was told that a friend of a colleague had phone calls go out to their congregation. It sounded like the pastor's voice and looked like the pastor was calling them. Scammers were able to use Artificial Intelligence to replicate the pastor's voice based on sermons that were posted online and use it to create a message asking for gift cards. If a request for any financial contributions hasn't been made by a member of the congregation in person during Sunday announcements. or in our church's newsletter, please be cautious and verify that it is not a scam before making any contributions.
