

Valley Youth House was open day and night, ensuring that vulnerable, abused and homeless young people in the community had access to shelter and counseling. Even then, they represented more than just a roof and beds; they were an organization committed to building a solid foundation for every individual who came through their doors.

That same dedication still drives them today, as they have grown from that first house in the Valley to over 300 residential sites throughout Pennsylvania. Though their reach and programming has vastly expanded, their mission remains the same.

For over 50 years, they have been proud to be there for generations. **VYH** stand ready to be there for the next generation as well. Their doors remain open – they just have more of them now.



First United Church Hellertown Consistory Minutes

Consistory Minutes July 14, 2025

In attendance: Keith Lentz, Ashlynn Mixa, Amy Mixa, Diane French, Karen Frankenfield, Joan Kiak, Sandy Panick, Tammie Vosburg, Marji Hughes

Meeting opened with prayer at 6:36 pm. Minutes were accepted as read.

Treasurer's Report – Tammie stated that we are currently at a break even standpoint, thanks in part to a "last minute" yearly donation at the end of June, even though member contributions are down (as is normal for summer months) Our investment returns are 4.2% as of July 1. Our financial advisor sees us as in good economic positions and projects investment growth heading forward. There will be a 6 month statement sent out in the next few weeks, using an example from PNEC. It has been suggested that there be an audit to stay up front with our reporting.

Motion carried to repay the general fund \$150 for Pastor Rich's ordination anniversary present from the Wimmer Spiritual fund.

Motion carried to pay \$150 for the VBS ad in Saucon Source from the Wimmer Youth fund.

Pastor's Report - No report—Pastor Becky in Missouri at UCC General Synod

Fath Formation – Marji Hughes - VBS is getting close. Mission project for the week is the Center for Animal Health and Welfare in Easton. Donations will be accepted throughout the month of August. Registrations a bit low, but slowly climbing. Backpack Blessing Sunday – August 24. Sunday School begins Sept 14. 1 day Women's Retreat Sept. 27 (at Lower Saucon UCC)

Elders' Report: Amy Mixa – August mission is Valley Youth House. Next meeting Sept 11.

Deacons' Report: Sandy Panick - Communion for Anniversary Sunday, July 20. Next communion August 3rd.

Trustees' Report: A cleaning and evaluation was done of our air conditioning systems by E.F. Laudenslager on 7/3/25. Repairs were made to the Narthex unit at an additional cost of \$235.60 in addition to the service cost of \$1290.00 Sanctuary system needs additional work, including capacitors and contactors for \$554.53. Motion by Diane French, seconded by Amy Mixa to pay the additional cost. Motion carried

Trustees surveyed the church inside and out to discuss condition and needs for future projects. They are looking into the cost for painting or putting aluminum around windows on the Durham Street side of building. Church grounds were weeded by Doug Major and Wayne Packer. Discussion on whether there are any groups who need to do community service that may weed, etc. in the future. Also on the back burner for the future, more outlets in the Wimmer Room.
