


Wayne Packer tells everyone about the special "frig" magnet from his grandmother that reminds him about Faith. This was his item in the Treasure Chest.





First United Church Hellertown Consistory Meeting Minutes (in brief)

Monday November 10, 2025 at 6:30 pm in the Wimmer Room

Keith Lentz opened the meeting at 6:31. Pastor Becky opened with prayer.

Attendance: Keith Lentz, Doug Major, Diane French, Karen Frankenfield, Ashlyn Mixa, Amy Mixa, Sandy Bender, Sandy Panick, Joan Kiak, Chip Wagner. Absent: Wayne Packer, Marji Hughes

Minutes approved with corrections. Motion Sandy Panick, 2nd Sandy Bender.

Treasurer's Report- Reported a \$13,000 deficit. Savings were used to meet the needs of the budget. Report on the Penny Party fundraiser as successful with \$2247 made. Thank you to all who participated. All those in attendance were encouraged by those serving from the church.

Treasurer also indicated the need for a Stewardship Committee and Campaign, separate from the Fundraising Committee. The Wimmer Fund and its governances were explained, Discussion of the Endowment and Memorial Funds and the access of 4% of those funds can be used if needed. Recommended a workshop for use of funds and congregation understanding financial opportunities for donations to the church. Preliminary budget was distributed to consistory and treasurer asked for questions regarding the budget be emailed to her before next meeting.

Pastor's Report approved as presented. Her continuing education is going well toward her doctorate. Trunk or Freat went well. Pastor suggested an information packet about our church. Discussion about having an additional Trunk or Treat in our own parking lot. Pastor attended the Penny Party. Confirmation classes are going well. They meet 2X month. Pastor will be using Nov 25,26 and week after Christmas as her vacation time.

Elders' Report-There is a suggestion box in the Narthex for Mission Project suggestions. College and Military gift card list has been completed.

Deacons' Report- More ushers are needed. Discussed possible additions. Kitchen committee list has been completed for 2026 year.

Trustees' Report-Parking lot light is being fixed. Discussion about 8 trucks that continue to be parked long term around the church. Noted on street parking is public parking.

Correspondence- AA has requested 2nd night (Tuesdays 6:45-8PM). Checking on insurance for church usage. Does staff have to open/close building? Scouts request to use Wimmer room 2X month and kitchen. Consistory will require more information for need of the room. Phyllis will check with the scouts. Requests for use of Wimmer room, kitchen, parking lot. Sexton fee also.

Safety and Security- There are now combination locks on Pastor's and Secretary's offices.

Altar Guild- New trees for altar area of church have been purchased.

Technology Report- Team will be getting quotes for possible screens on walls next to altar areas.

Nominations- Positions for an Elder and Deacon are needed.

New Business- Recommendation for separate committee for Stewardship. Motion for separate program by Amy Mixa. 2nd Doug Major, unanimous vote.

- Discussion regarding storage of project supplies. Anyone cleaning closets and storage areas needs to advise the office if they are moved to a different location.
- There are now 2 separate associations for conference. The Mountain Valley Association is the second. Consideration for financial support. Discussion for support and where finances would come from.

Motion to adjourn 8:20 by Amy Mixa. Second by Ashlyn Mixa. All in favor. Meeting closed with the Lord's

Next meeting is December 8th, 6:30, in the Wimmer Room.
