





Treasurer's Report – Tammie Vosburg

Report accepted as submitted.

Highlights:

- •. We have a surplus at present due to a generous gift to the Remembrance Fund designated for General Use. (\$1,187 surplus)
- Insurance repairs are completed, and we will file for a Depreciation Insurance Recovery Claim.
- Our financial investment report is positive for this month.
- Our giving for May had a nice recovery, but we are still below budget for the year.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Becky

Report accepted as submitted.

Total Hours: 93—Hours Dedicated to Worship: 18, Hours Dedicated to Pastoral Care: 8, Continuing Education Hours: 11, Office Hours: 27

Meetings

- HAM met on 5/15. We discussed a joint Service of the Longest Night. The Service was requested to be held at the Carriage House. More details to come.
- •I attended the Keystone Conference meeting at Penn State from 6/7-6/9. We discussed the potential merger of the four Pennsylvania conferences of the UCC.

Faith Formation Report: Pastor Becky and Marji Hughes

Highlights:

- We discussed the composition of a letter regarding open-table communion that will go out to the congregation.
- The VBS volunteers' meeting is scheduled for July 1.

Curriculum: Discussion about policy for selecting curriculum for our children through adult education. We need to ensure that the chosen curriculum aligns with the policies and beliefs of the United Church of Christ.

Motion: Amy Mixa moved that the Pastor, the Minister of Faith Formation, and the Faith Formation Committee shall approve all selected curricula for children to adult education for any group meeting within our church building. Sandy Bender seconded the motion. All were in favor, none opposed.

Elders' Report: Georgie Stuempfle

We spoke with the pastor about the Caring Spirits program and homebound parishioners and reviewed the entire church directory list.

Deacons' Report: Sandy Panick

Discussion: We propose adding communion opportunities to the church calendar year. After discussion and a general vote by Consistory members, we suggest scheduling communion at least once a month in addition to our regularly scheduled yearly communions. An additional communion will be scheduled on the first Sunday of each month unless it falls on a regular holiday.

Trustees' Report: Ann Brown

- •The church restoration project was completed, but we contacted the painter to review the project, as painting at the altar archway is unacceptable.
- •Additional Electric Lighting for choir area estimates are pending. We continue to seek a provider to complete this project.
