

First United Church Hellertown Consistory Minutes Monday April 14, 2025, at 6:30 pm

Present: Sandy Bender, Diane French, Marji Hughes, Jane Joyce, Keith Lentz, Joan Kiak, Doug Major, Amy Mixa, Ashlynn Mixa, Wayne Packer, Sandy Panick, Rebekah Thomas, Tammie Vosburg and Chip Wagner Absent: Karen Frankenfield

Minutes: Date: 3/10/202 Minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Tammie Vosburg Highlights: Operating deficit for 2025 YTD ending March 31 is \$1,400. This value excludes Remembrance funds and benevolence contributions

- Receipts are short by \$1,675 over last year but short of budget by \$5,150.
- Expenses are less than 2024 by \$1,100 and under budget our 2025 by \$790
- Our contributions are well below budget and the previous year's giving
- Insurance Cost: GuideOne our current carrier has come back with some credits and is still evaluating other possible credits. Security and fire upgrades resulted in a credit of \$49. Waiting on possible additional credit for electrical upgrades. Next year GuideOne will no longer offer a \$1,000 deductible, if we move to the \$2,500 deductible in 2025, we can save \$482 resulting in a premium increase of 11% rather than 25% Total annual package \$9,133
- Erie Insurance placed a bid for both a \$1,000 deductible and \$2,500 deductible. Both totals were well over GuideOne \$12,804 and \$12,494 respectively. The other two insurance companies were unable to compete and declined to bid.
- Tammie's suggestion at this point would be to stay with GuideOne and since our church has the capital improvement accounts for that the church increases the deductible to \$2,500. Motion was made and approved to increase our insurance deductible from \$1,000 to \$2500 in order to achieve savings on premium.
- Pastor's Report– Highlights: Pastor Becky: Total Hours: 119— Breakdown of hours for major responsibilities Hours: Worship: 43 Hours. Pastoral Care: 17, Continuing Education: 7, Office Hours: 31 Meetings: 5 Discussion: Pastor Becky asked to be a delegate for the General Assembly July 11-15 in Kansas City, Missouri. Pastor Becky will investigate the price. A Motion was made and approved to pay for Pastor Becky

to attend the General Assembly as a delegate.

- Faith Formation Report: Highlights: The young children sang Palm Sunday, April 13. Children and Youth Sunday, May 18th theme will be the early followers of Jesus. This will be followed by an indoor picnic with sundaes and is the last Sunday School until fall. Combined meeting with teachers and Faith Formation is in the works. Sunday a.m. Adult Bible Study beginning a new book "Abide" about 1st, 2nd, and 3rd John. Bibles and Brunch will meet through June, starting up again in the fall. Confirmation class is finishing our 2 years together, heading toward Confirmation Sunday, June 1. Road Trip VBS August 4-8, registration website is up and running. Leader and helper meeting next month tba. This month Marii attended 2 workshops given jointly by Penn Northeast and Southeast Conferences on current issues and trends that affect local churches.
- Elders' Report: Amy Mixa: One Great Hour of Sharing is scheduled for the month of April and the Heifer Project is scheduled for May.
- Deacons' Report: Communion will be on Maundy Thursday and Easter. Usher Team 3 is assigned for Maundy Thursday. Team 4 will be assigned for Easter.
