

Treasurer's Report: Tammie Vosburg, Treasurer

- Annual investment returns for 2023 is 3.78%
- We have not met our budgeted expenditures for the last two months through income contributions.
- Our new copier monthly lease is 10% less than the previous contract and print page per page is 7% less.
- The 2024 Budget Collection is underway.
