Did you notice how long the lovely flowers lasted during the cooler weather? Thank you to all of the gardeners who took such good care of them throughout the growing season.



First United Church Hellertown Consistory Meeting Minutes (in brief)

Monday October 13, 2025 at 6:30 pm in the Wimmer Room

Keith Lentz called the meeting to order. Pastor Becky offered the opening prayer:

Treasurer's Report by Tammie Vosburg. **Wimmer Fund** (Memorial Fund): Originally endowed with \$550,000, now valued at ~\$950,000. Generates investment income used for approved church purposes under strict donor restrictions. Financial advisor manages and provides forecasts on fund performance.

The church manages **five primary "buckets" of Wimmer funds**: Major Improvement Fund,- available for major improvements (e.g., roof, boiler, or sewer repairs). Spiritual Fund – Restricted for ministry-related expenses., Youth Fund – Restricted for youth activities, Senior Fund – Restricted for senior ministry activities., and Wider Church Fund – Supports Penn Northeast Conference and broader church mission work. Example: Wimmer funds helped purchase a new office computer by allocating portions across multiple restricted accounts. These funds cannot be used for general operating expenses such as utilities or salaries

Capital Fund: Established approximately three years ago, initially funded through COVID-related federal support (PPP) and memorial gifts. Current balance ~\$63,000. Intended for long-term capital projects like the slate roof replacement and boiler maintenance.

Market Performance, **Risks**: Investment growth has benefited from strong stock market performance, but members noted potential risk if markets decline (loss of income). A 20% market drop would significantly affect available funds for operations.

Operational Challenges: General operating fund down by ~\$15,000. Funds cannot be used for day-to-day expenses (utilities, salaries). Lowest operating cash levels since 2023..Decline attributed to membership losses and flat giving patterns (some members still giving at historic rates).

Future Planning, **Sustainability:** Consensus that membership growth and a stewardship campaign are critical. Suggestion to use memorial funds as matching incentives for future fundraising campaigns. Encouragement to run a stewardship emphasis (potentially November-focused) to encourage recurring giving. Members acknowledged the seriousness of the financial situation.. All agreed transparency was important. Appreciation expressed for the pastor's recent stewardship message and leadership on the topic.

Elders Report – Supply Pastor Discussion Members discussed recent feedback regarding a Supply Pastor's sermon. It was agreed that Supply Pastors bring varying styles and perspectives, and occasional disagreement is natural. Pastor Becky clarified that she does not pre-approve sermons, but reviews any concerns afterward. She emphasized her role in maintaining balance, unity, and open communication.

Missions Update: Discussed member feedback about mission selections. Decision made to add a suggestion box in the Narthex for congregational mission ideas. Reminder that donations are voluntary; multiple mission options will continue to be provided. The College Student Gift Card Ministry will continue this year (cards and Starbucks gift cards to be distributed in November/December). The Hot Dog Mission at the Halloween Parade will include a donation can; Phyllis to confirm details.

Deacons Report: Nothing new to report. Next communion is scheduled for November 2. Preparation for 2025 usher letters and schedule will begin in December.

Correspondence: A letter of appreciation was received from the AA Group that meets in the building.. They requested use of the Fellowship Hall on New Year's Day (9 a.m.–6 p.m.) for a recovery event. Motion by Sandy Panick to approve the use of space for the quoted rental and custodial fee. Seconded by Amy Mixa. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Committee: Doug Major and Keith Lentz met to prepare agenda during Pastor Becky's vacation.

Music and Worship: Church decorating for Advent scheduled for November 24–25, ready by November 30 for Hanging of the Greens.

Safety and Security: Concern raised that church doors were not locked and monitors were not watched during a recent Sunday. Issue occurred due to absent ushers; noted as a one-time fluke. Discussion on developing a backup plan if usher team members are unavailable.. Consensus: current system generally works well; no new committee needed.

Consistory Minutes (cont.)

Stewardship and Fundraising: Committee will review Penny Party inventory and prepare for upcoming event. Volunteers and donations being organized.

Old Business:

Technology: Ongoing computer and screen updates nearly complete; James assisting..

Website: Rachel Panick volunteered to assist Ann Brown.

Consistory Vacancies: Still seeking a new Deacon and Elder.

Office Security: Pastor Becky reported her office heat was turned on without authorization. Mark Mixa to recommend keypad locks for office doors; purchase to be made with church credit card. Access codes will remain confidential. Budd will research lock boxes for thermostats to prevent unauthorized changes.

New Business:

Conference Delegate—Marji volunteered to serve as delegate to the Penn Northeast Conference (PNEC) for the November 1 meeting.. A motion by Diane French to approve Marji as delegate, with \$35 fee covered by Wimmer funds. Motion seconded and approved.

Fellowship Hour: Consistory will host a Fellowship Hour following Remembrance Sunday (November 2) in the Wimmer Room, with light finger foods.

Adjournment With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Ashlyn Mixa, seconded, and approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m. Pastor Becky thanked members for their time and concluded with closing remarks and prayer.
