First United Church Hellertown Consistory Meeting Minutes (in brief)

Monday September 8, 2025 at 6:30 pm in the Wimmer Room

In Attendance: Keith Lentz, Diane French, Sandy Bender, Wayne Packer, Amy Mixa, Ashlynn Mixa, Sandy Panick, Karen Frankenfield

Missing: Doug Major, Chip Wagner, Joan Kiak

Keith Lentz called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm. Pastor Becky offered the opening prayer:

Motion was made by Sandy Panick, seconded by Karen Frankenfield to approve the minutes of the August 11, 2025 meeting.

Treasurer's Report by Tammie Vosburg. Our cash flow deficit is \$6852 which is actually encouraging following the summer. For most budget categories our actually spending is below the approved budget numbers. Fundraising is a little below the past few years, but our expenses are holding steady. Currently \$8020 in checking, however which won't make payroll, so some funds may need to be moved over from savings. Motion by Diane French, 2nd by Amy Mixa to transfer \$1900 to Capital Fund which will remain tagged as remembrance money for Carol Petruno. There are still Wimmer Funds left that may be used before December 31, 2025. A preliminary budget for 2026 will be available at the November Consistory meeting.

Pastor Becky reported that she and the consistory president met with a member who had sent an email with worship, membership and moderation, concerns. She will be meeting with the elders to begin a discussion, including but not limited to the following issues: 1/messages perceived as political statements from the pulpit by supply pastors, 2/ missions 1st UCC supports, and 3/divides that need to be bridged.

Marji Hughes reported for **Faith Formation** that our Fall program year theme is "See what's poppin' at 1st UCC" Sunday, Sept 14, Sunday School returns and there will be popcorn decorations, popcorn balls with the church logo, and fresh popped popcorn for Fellowship Hour. Sunday Morning Bible Study, Bibles and Brunch, Treasure Chest Children's Messages, and a new Confirmation class, all start up this month. The Women's one day Mini Retreat is coming up on September 27 which will be held at Lower Saucon this year. Youth Group begins and Trunk or Treat will be held in October. The committee is looking to hold an Advent luncheon or workshop or other event to celebrate the season.

Amy Mixa for the **Elders** reported that they will be meeting Thursday, September 11, in part to discuss member concerns over our worship service.

Deacons' Report: Sandy Panick – nothing new to report.

Keith Lentz reported that the **Trustees** are adding a line item to the 2026 budget for \$1,290.00 for yearly maintenance for our AC system with E.F. Laudenslager. The contract bill would be due in July 2026.

Correspondence included a Thank-you from the Center for Animal Health and Welfare for our donations in August. Adding them to our monthly mission list will be discussed at a future missions meeting.

Committee Reports:

Pastoral Relations Committee has 3 members: Rachel Panick, Phyllis Heil-Henry, Ann Brown and Pastor Becky has one more church member to ask if they are willing to be on the committee. Pastoral Relations is a two-year commitment.

Executive Meeting: Doug Major and Keith Lentz met September 4th to plan the agenda.

Music and Worship: the Choir began to sing on 9/7/25 which was also communion Sunday. October 5th is World Communion Sunday. November 2 is Remembrance Sunday, All Saints Day is also communion. November 24 is Thanksgiving Sunday with our "Fill the Sill" blessing. The first Sunday in Advent, November 30 will begin with the Hanging of the Greens and transition to our Advent Theme "What Do You Fear? Insisting on Hope this Advent"

Safety and Security: Sandy Bender asks us to please come to her if we think of any other ways our church can add to its safety and security. Concerns over AA not fully closing or locking the front door when they leave as the choir is still practicing, also, that they have easy access to the offices due to the placement of extra keys. Ann Brown will be asked to speak with AA. Motion by Wayne Packer, 2nd by Amy Mixa to purchase and install keypads for the front office and the pastor's office, with limited access by staff etc. Mark Mixa will be asked to assist with this.

Consistory Minutes (cont.)

Stewardship/ Fundraising: Ashlynn Mixa reports \$150 profit from Community Day because they only asked for donations for the popcorn. All supplies were donated and there is plenty left over for the 1st Day of Sunday School and other upcoming activities. T-shirts are still available – mainly youth sizes. Penny Party meeting Thursday at 6:30 pm for our Nov. 9 event. Asking for new donations only as this is NOT a yard sale. Our annual nutroll sale is about to begin, with orders due October 31, with pick up on November 20. \$18 each. If we sell \$100 we receive \$4 for each roll sold.

Altar: no report

Tech Committee: James Rosenberger is looking for a work around for Publisher after October 2026 when Microsoft no longer supports it. Phyllis will call our security company to move the security system to the new computer. James gifted a booster for the projector which gave VBS a very smooth week for the music and the videos.

Old Business: We will continue to explore the possibility of putting the slides that are shown on the Live Video feed before church starts, on the central screen prior to worship, including the option of installing 2 side screens instead. Many parishioners do not feel the "advertisements" are appropriate nor do they wish the altar to be blocked when preparing their "hearts and minds for worship".

Please get new and important information to Ann Brown and Sara Heintzelman so they may update our website. Especially if it is NOT in the newsletter.

2 new Consistory Members are needed: 1 Deacon (2026), 1 Elder (immediately).

Discussion over lack of volunteers to be the secretary each month for the meeting. Wayne suggested we try AI to transcribe the meeting for us and then *someone* would correct them and add in the committee reports that have been emailed prior to the meeting. Consensus to try this out. Keith volunteered to shorten the report and make any corrections. Our custodian Budd has agreed to mow the church grounds for the remainder of the year for the same price that we paid Owen. He will be asked if he wishes to continue for 2026.

New Business: A committee will be formed to discuss the upcoming 250th celebration of America. An old-fashioned church picnic, and a 1776 church service are two options presented. Church members are asked to help think of other ways we can celebrate and to join the committee.

Adjournment was at 8:06 with a motion by Diane French. Sandy Panick 2nd.
