



CANCELLING DEVISES

To date only two (2) cancelling devises have been recorded used by the British South Africa Company.

Various different <u>Date perfins</u> are found on these stamps indicative of Revenue use, with Day, Month, & Year in a vertical format Also found with Rhodesia Overprints and surcharges.





The word "**USED**" is also found perfinned into stamps again indicating that the stamps have been used. Cachet or manuscript cancels.



B. S. A. COMPANY PERFIN

(**BSAC, BSACO, BSA Company**) Mercantile company based in London that was incorporated in October 1889 under a Royal Charter at the instigation of <u>Cecil Rhodes</u>, with the object of acquiring and exercising commercial and administrative rights in South-central Africa. The charter was initially granted for 25 years, and it was extended for a further 10-year period in 1915.

Almost always noted on stamps with <u>Revenue</u> use. Company Cachet or manuscript cancels.









The area of the British East Africa Protectorate was previously the domain of the Sultans of Zanzibar. In 1887 the administration of the Province was granted to the British East Africa Association, and Post Offices were established at Lamu and Zanzibar early in 1890. In 1903 these stamps were superseded by the stamps of East Africa & Uganda Protectorate.

The "MBI" die is a partial of India <u>M 23</u> used by the Mercantile Bank of India. I suspect a partial Madras cancel ! The other dies are "RB" <u>R 3</u> of India and was used by Ralli Brothers. And "E&O" <u>E 25b</u> of India used by Ernsthusen & Oesterley.




Between 1899 and 1956, Anglo-Egyptian Sudan was administered jointly as a condominium by Egypt and the UK. The condominium did not have its own individual flag. Instead, the flag of Egypt and the flag of the UK were always flown together, with the British flag taking precedence.





GENERAL GORDON THE SUDAN

AND PERFINS

For the interest of the collector I am featuring the cutting below, it was written by Rosemary Smith and is taken from the Perfin Society Bulletin 295 August 1998.

From Rosemary Smith

Ever since I first became interested in perfins, in 1970, I have collected any articles which I saw in philatelic magazines which had a bearing on the subject.

One of these articles which I cut out, and only recently re-read, was in *Stamp Monthly, October 1975.* Stuart Rossiter, FRPSL, wrote about '*The Giegler Archive*'. Carl Giegler was Chief Engineer of the Telegraphs of the Soudan and the Red Sea, then the Chief of the Posts and Telegraph at Khartoum, and later was raised to the rank of Pasha.


There was an illustration of a letter from Col.Gordon (later General) to Carl Giegler. Unfortunately it is undated but the whole Archive appears to be letters to Giegler mostly from 1874 to 1883. The text of the letter reads:-

My dear Giegler,

If Cartland would perforate all the stamps he sends up here, with the initial S, __it would be the best plan, (the British P.O. does this for many great firms in London, to prevent the theft of their stamps.) No perforated stamp could be sold at Cairo, no unperforated stamp could be sold at London.

Every letter from any town, of the Sudan, must have the perforated stamp on it.



South Sudan split from Sudan on 9-7-2011, and as such is the world's youngest country.



India stamps were used in British Somaliland from 1884 to c1903 at Berbera and Zeila. ● The following dies are India <u>M 23</u> used by the Mercantile Bank of India, and India <u>C 7M</u> used by the Army & Navy Co-operative Society Ltd. It is feasible that both of these companies were doing business in British Somaliland at that time.
