FAROESE PERFINS

On January 30, 1975, the Faroe Islands, a possession of Denmark, began to issue its own postal paper. Fourteen regular postage stamps, ranging in value from 5 ore to 500 ore, comprise the first set of definitives bearing the name "Føroyar" (see Fig-

While examining a collection of used stamps from a correspondent on the islands, the author discovered one 90 ore perforated with the initials "V.L." (Figure 2) and postmarked Tørshavn. The postmaster of Tørshavn was contacted and the author was referred to the department store, P. F. Valdemar Lutzen of Tørshavn.

A letter to the owners was graciously answered by a complete set of the abovementioned stamps, perforated with the in-itials "V.L.," placed on cover, and post-marked Tørshavn. The enclosed letter stated that "these stamps are not used in business any longer, but we have the old machine to perforate the stamps."

Provisional Danish stamps were utilized rrovisional Danish stamps were utilized in the Faroes in 1919 and during World War II. However, none appear to have been perforated (Wowern 1975). Therefore, this appears to be the first listing of a perforated Faroese stamp (Figure 2).
