

CANADIAN REVENUE PERFINS by Jack Brandt

Most collectors of Canadian Perfins are aware that the listings in the Canadian Perfin handbook include revenue Perfins, but I have been surprised several times by some who didn't. So, I submit a little information on them.

The revenue Perfins can be divided into several groups. First there are those types which are found mainly on postal issues, but also on a few revenues. Most firms prior to about 20 years ago used many revenue stamps in their business, and they wished to protect these stamps, too, from theft. Some examples of these include the DTC(o) (D5), E (E2), and G/LD (G5) types shown in Figures 1, 2 and 3, respectively.




A second group may be found only on revenue stamps. Examples of these are BR (B9) and M&M (new), shown in Figures 4 and 5. Many of this group are US Perfin types used by companies conducting part of their business in Canada. The small CH (Cll) shown in Figure 6 is also known only on revenues, but may be more of a cancelling device than a true Perfin.



A third group is represented by punches, having solid-cut letters rather than a series of holes. All of these have only


