Charles Schoeps (#1315) has submitted the Perfin shown below, which appears to be a State of Michigan Perfin, but does not match any of the patterns shown in the Illustrated Catalog. It may have been listed in one of the Additions and Corrections Supplements, which the editor does not have at hand. Who can supply further information?

Charles points out that when this particular example is turned over, it becomes an EFO (Error, Freak or Oddity), because of the stamp's off-center perforation. He inquires as to whether there are any other members who collect Perfins on EFOs, as such. Step forward, you EFO Perfins collectors!





In response to Charles Schoeps' inquiry in the March Bulletin concerning an apparent State of Michigan Perfin which did not match any shown in the catalog, Vice President Dorothy Savage says she understands that this Perfin came about when every other pin was removed from the original perforator, and the feet were removed also, thus creating a new State of Michigan Perfin type.
