

The first U. S. perfin usage?

According to the postmark, this card was mailed in Bellefountain, Ohio, about 250 miles from Chicago, on March 23, 1907, and received the following day in Charleston, Indiana. It carries a 2¢ parcel post stamp perfinned HOYT (H-149) by the Hoyt Company of Chicago. If the postmark is authentic and the perfin proves to be genuine, then the card shows the earliest known use of a perfin in the United States. It was previously thought that the first perfin was used on June 27, 1908 by Kueffel & Esser of Hoboken, NJ. That usage has been confirmed by a cover bearing the K&E/Co (K-69) pattern. The Bellefountain, Ohio, postcard is in the collection of Alan R. Miskimin of San Antonio and is now in the process of being authenticated. We'll keep you posted on developments.
