It's tempting to think that the 'ITC' is for the 'Imperial Tobacco Co' and that the 'JS' is for John Sinclair (& Co Ltd), tobacco manufacturers, Newcastle-on-Tyne. Although (Sir) John Sinclair was later to become chairman and president of the 'Imperial Tobacco Co', his company didn't join until 1930.





(John) Browne & Co, Ident: Brick & Tile Maker including 'Bath' bricks, 25 West Quays, Bridgwater,

Somerset. Pmks: (Bri)dgwater.



'Bath' bricks ... were an early form of scouring pads, the forerunner of products like Vim and Ajax. The bricks were patented in the early 1820's by John Browne (1799-1872) and William Champion. They were made from river bank 'slime' which contained suitably gritty sediments, collected in pens and 'harvested' every couple of months. They were made into bricks before being fired. At its peak, 24 million 'Bath' bricks were being made by 10 Bridgwater companies.




