The 1938 British Industries Fair slogan was used Nov 1937 through to March 1938 - about 50 dies used.








A mixture of 4-pin and 5-pin high letters points to strikes of individual letter pairs, first one pair throughout the whole stack of sheet(s), followed by the other pair. If so, then another example of the pattern would likely show the same fixed pairs, but with "RC" positioned differently below, perhaps, lower/higher, and more to the left/right.

'J V Drake & Co' are known users of Perfins from at least 1895, when they used "JVD" (J8180.03v) 1895-1907, followed by "JVD" (J8180.02v) 1907-1940. These are 'SPG' Types, both 'Early' and 'Later' supplied by Waterlows & Sons. 'J Sloper & Co' took over the perforating business of Waterlows c1940 and replaced the 'SPG' with the 'regular' die "JVD" (J8180.01a) in use briefly 1940-1941. This die would have been destroyed in the "Blitz" on Sloper's Budge Row premises on the night of 10th May 1941. This is the entry from the back of the Sloper m/s ledger ...



Unusually, there is no reference in the ledger as to how the SWP was to be created, but clearly (including this new die) there were four attempts - "JV/D" (J8180.01p/02p/03p/04p) - over the wartime period 1941-1945, and perhaps beyond. A replacement 'regular' die wasn't made until well after hostilities had ceased in the shape of "JVD" (J8180.01), in use 1952-1965.
