It was formed as a civil parish in 1834 from the chapelry of Hammersmith that had existed in the ancient parish of Fulham (Middlesex) since 1631. The parish was grouped with Fulham as the 'Fulham District' from 1855 until 1886, when separate parish administration was restored - i.e. Hammersmith was administered by Hammersmith Vestry. In 1889 it became part of the County of London, and in 1900 became a *Metropolitan Borough*, and Hammersmith Vestry became *Hammersmith Borough Council*. In 1965 Hammersmith Metropolitan Borough was abolished and became the northern part of the London Borough of Hammersmith, and since 1979 has been renamed the '*London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham*' - Wikipedia.

Adam Edward Lejeune, a Naturalised British Subject born in Frankfurt c1845, died in Zurich between 1891 and 1901, possibly after 1895 which was the last directory reference), and two brothers Thomas Bartram Shimwell (born Manchester 1850, died 1922) and Walter Shimwell (born Manchester 1856, died 1927).

In 1883 A E Lejeune was working for the Shipping Merchants 'McNair, Greenwood & Co, 39 Hilton St, Manchester, but by 1886 'Leujeume, Shimwell & Brother' were at this address. Their 'TA' was 'LESHIMBRO'. By 1903 the company was now called 'Shimwell & Brother' trading out of 32 Bloom St, Manchester, and still using the 'TA' 'LESHIMBRO', which was still the situation in the 1909 directory. If the were using the old TA, then it's reasonable to assume that they were still using the old Perfin as well. By a 1913 newspaper report, 'Shimwell & Brother' were still at 32 Broom St, Manchester which they had taken on a 5 year lease on 25th March 1911. By this time they also had a branch in Calcutta. In 1780 Thomas Bell and Alexander Balfour formed the company 'Bell & Balfour'. In 1833 the partnership was dissolved. Thomas Bell (or more likely a relative of the original Thomas Bell) traded on his own account until c1879 when he was joined by his sons Thomas and William forming 'Thomas Bell & Sons', who erected Belmont Works. Another son, James, also joined the firm, date unknown. Heathfield Works was added in 1889, which is around the time the company took on 'Limited' liability and 'of Dundee' was inserted in the company name. In 1920 it amalgamated with other jute firms to form 'Jute Industries Ltd'. Products included hessians, jute, tarpaulins, flax and jute, roofing canvas and 'scenic' canvas. It went into voluntary liquidation in 1933.
