According to the Sloper m/s Ledger, ‘Bowmaker Ltd’ were using an unknown, single headed “B/L<sup>d</sup>” die which would also have been destroyed in the “Blitz”. There was no ‘SWP’ allocated for either company, just the use of a single headed “B/L<sup>d</sup>” die, but none are known from the period, only “B/L<sup>td</sup>” (B4550.01a). Both users are known to have used “B/L<sup>td</sup>” (B4550.01) 1945-1975, and so B4550.01a ‘fills the gap’ perfectly.

**Leopold Hirsch** (1857-1932) was born at Heppenheim, Grand Duchy of Hesse, to German Jewish parents, Baruch and Nina Hirsch. Shortly after leaving the Grand Duchy of Hesse and arriving in London, Hirsch was employed as a broker (the 1881 census shows him as a 24 year old Clerk at the Stock Exchange) by Sir Julius Wernher. He retired from 'L Hirsch & Co' on 24<sup>th</sup> December 1897. When he arrived in London, he only had £5 in his pocket, but by the time of his death in September 1932 at the Hotel Metropole in Brighton, he had made a fortune. His probate records show £365,890 which equates to £23½ million today. As a successful financier and art collector, he became part of the British establishment, and lived at 10 Kensington Palace Gardens in central London.
