





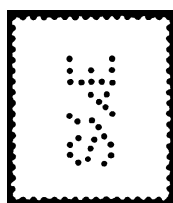

Note: The “&” has 13 pins, although an example has not been reported.





Although currently no stamp details are known, this die would be a natural follow on from “JAS/ & C” (J0330.01), in use 1915-1939. J0330.02 has all the characteristics of a die made by J Sloper & Co as a result of their pre-WWII refurbishment programme, and would have been destroyed in the “Blitz” on Sloper’s Budge Row Works on the night of 10th May 1941.


