THE WORLD'S FIRST PERFIN?

We hear that John Nelson has recently acquired from a London dealer what could be the only surviving copy of the Copestake Moore Crampton & Co., perfin "SC", submitted to the G.P.O, as a specimen-when official permission to perforate stamps with initials was sought in 1868. The stamp is a ld red, plate 73, the earliest yet recorded. More news about this later.



A rather smaller combined issue than we had intended but time ran out on us again. Some of the postmarks seen on the Tawmanian Pictorials perforated "T" are Chudleigh, Enison, Golconda, Hythe, Margate, New Norfolk, Newport, New Town.

The 6x6 T puncture was used on some of the Commonwealth stamps. Mr Carr has the 1942 ½d and the 1943 1d, but the "T" perfins on Australian stamps are usually 5x5. Many issues will have been used by the State Departments, the follow—ing list is as reported by those members who returned Worksheets.

The OS perfin used by the Federal Departments dates from 1904 (September 27th is the earliest date seen up to Now) Mr Ingles says that the stamps are scarce on cover, but are easier to find in mint state than the "T" perforated issues where they are very elusive when mint.

4.8. VICTORIA

Stamps punctured "OS" were ready for use by both State & Commonwealth Government Departments at the end of December 1902. They were prepared by the Victoria State Government Printer. As the same perf in was used by both Governments one could only distinguish between Federal and State use when a stamp was on cover with identification.

The Worksheets showed that almost all stamps recorded appeared to have the Crown over A watermark, but once again it is often difficult to be certain of the watermark when a stamp is perforated with initials. The following list is as given by the S.C.A. 1944, and members stamps are marked #
