Mr. J.S. Nelson recently discovered the identity of the user of this perfin. So far only three examples of the stamps used by the Ontario Government in London have been reported. Mr Nelson has a S.G. type 104, K.G.V, ld, with Royal Cypher watermark. Mr Rymer Young, too, has an example of this stamp, and he also has a K.G.V. ld "Lion" with a London postmark, 18 May 1912.

The following background notes are taken from literature published by Ontario House, London, and sent to me by Mr J Nelson.

In 1869 an Ontario journalist, Thomas White Jr. came to the United Kingdom as Special Commissioner of Emigration, representing the Province of Ontario. At that time there were no offices, and the work of promoting emigration was carried out by Commissioners in co-operation with shipping agencies, etc.

Mr White was succeeded by other Commissioners, and in 1908 N.B. Colcock opened the first official Ontario Goverment office at 163 Strand, London. In 1930 a new building was erected at 163-164 Strand, and was officially opened by Prime Minister F. Howard Ferguson of Ontario. This was the first Ontario House. Unfortunately, it had to be closed in 1934 as a measure of economy. The buildings were disposed of, and the Province had no representative for the next ten years.

In 1944 James S.P. Armstrong was the Agent General and a building in Charles II Street became the new Ontario House. Allan A. Rowan-Legg succeeded Mr Armstrong in 1967.

Today, there is a staff of about 50 at Ontario House, and work is done to strengthen trade, commercial immigration, and social and cultural links between Ontario and Britain.

It seems that an Assistant Commissioner was posted to Liverpool in 1880 and that he was still there in 1900, so there is a possibility that stamps with the perfin ONT/GOV could have been used there, perhaps after 1908 when the Government Office had been opened in London?
