We are often told by our members overseas, particularly in the United States, that the bulletin is taking anything up to 8 weeks to reach them. Some of our members are now receiving the bulletin by air mail and we are prepared to do the same for anyone who pays the additional cost.

SECTION 6 SOUTH AMERICA

Undoubtedly, the truly Official Perfins of this Section are the "Oficial" of Guatemala, and the "G.N" (National Government) of Venezuela.

The other Countries included in this Section have stamps that have been perforated by the authorities in a variety of ways, and for a number of different reasons - such as, the Precancelled Perfins of the Argentine; the changing of Official stamps into ordinary stamps by perforation, as in Salvador; and the particular circumstance of one stamp in Paraguay.

6.1. ARGENTINE

The quotations, information, and illustrations are taken from an article published in "Precancels" April-May 1959 by kind permission of the Editor, Mr. C. W. E. Coles.

"The Argentina is a very large country, well over a million square miles in area. Large parts of the country are sparcely populated and hundreds of miles from the towns, and in particular from the capital, Buenos Ayres, where most of the newspapers are sent in bulk through the posts. To facilit -ate the posting of newspapers either singly or in bulk it has been the practice to precancel stamps in sheets or part

The first precancels took the form of date stamps.

In 1891 machines were introduced to precancel stamps by perforating them in sheets. The stamps so cancelled were used to send newspapers posted in bulk and replaced the date stamps.

The official perforation of stamps was the equivalent of a cancellation. In the Early years of its use, (Types 1 & 2) it was used alone; later in some sub offices a supplementary cancellation with a handstamp, pen or pencil was also applied. Specimens of the 1917-24 issues are often met with perforated with Type 5, which bear a pen line as well as a handstamp.

In the majority of issues the high values are common and the low values scarce, since the latter were only used for fractions of pesos.

Stamps with two different perforations are very rare, and are presumably due to stamps already perforated being returned for later use. The 2 pesos stamp of the 1896 issue (S.G.257, Yvert 108, Scott 120) is known with perforations of types 4 and 5. Stamps with double perforation in the same type are known although scarce.

Blocks with the perforation missing from one row are very rare. A block of 9 of the 50c stamp of the 1896 issue (S.G. 255, Yvert 104, Scott 116) six stamps with and three without perforation have been recorded.

Some stamps are found with a single hole perforation, 5% mm., in diameter. These are private punctures and not precancels.

Perforating machines were also used from 1905 to 1931 to precancel stamps used in Money Order Offices. These have the word "CHANCELADO" or a date in perfin figures."
