It seems clear that the first one is Slopers own perfin and it is fairly obvious that the others are from an order which they over filled and are using up on their own postage. However, what is interesting is the numeral perforation, this does not seem to have been reported before.

# NOTES TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ACCOUNTS OF THE SECURITY ENDORSEMENT AND PERFIN SOCIETY OF G.B. FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st AUGUST. 1971.

Note 1 The cost of the Society's duplicator, purchased in 1964, has been included in the Accounts for the year as fully depreciated, having a written down value of £1.

The General Fund has been correspondingly adjusted by this amount. It would cost £50\* to replace the duplicator with a new one of a similar type.

Note 3 Expenditure on stationery, duplicating materials and envelopes is included in the Accounts in the year in which they are purchased, with the result that stocks of such items are considered to be of no value.

# HON. TREASURER'S REPORT

With the sale of Mr Jennings' book virtually at an end, the Society's income was £69 less than last year, despite a small increase in subscription income.

The deficit for the year of £18 shows that an increase in subscriptions is really necessary to prevent the Society from slipping into a state of poor financial health, particularly with regard to our forthcoming publication on railway perfins and an illustrated perfin catalogue.

We hope that no further increase will be necessary for a few years and members will continue to support the Society by not only continuing as members, but also by helping to add to the information already known about perfins.

Membership at the 31st August 1971 stood at 110, a net increase of 3 for the year.

It would be gratefully appreciated if meabers remember the following when making remittances:

- a) Remmittances.. other than annual subscriptions, will not be acknowledged unless requested.
- b) All cheques and postal orders should be made payable to the Society and not to individual officers.
- c) Members in the U.K. should only make remittances by stamps for amounts of 5p or under.
- d) Members who live overseas are asked to send bank notes where possible or, failing that, international money orders when making payments to the Society. Those in the U.S.A. who send chegtes must expect to bear a substantial collection charge, which is likely to be as much as 30p per cheque. This charge is made on the Society by deduction from the proceeds of the cheque, so that all those members in the U.S.A, who wish wish to pay by cheque must allow for this bank charge, when making payments in this way. The Society's bank has also introduced a commission commission of 5p on cashing bank notes. It now remains for me to thank the Officers and Committee for their

support during the year, and to thank Ron Bowman in particular for his invaluable assistance.

Notes: Die 1 is recorded in Mr Jennings book as having been seen on the two plate numbers given. Can anyone else confirm this die and in particular whether the full stops are present btween the letters.

Die II has no stops between the S and W and the W and R although the spacing is such that stops may have existed at some time. It is possible therefore that Dies 1 and 11 are really the same die.

A photographic reproduction of Die 1 would be appreciated if anyone can supply one.

# Railway Worksheet No.8

## GREAT WESTERN RAILWAY COMPANY

This Company was one of the most prolific users of perfins and some 10 different dies exist. In this worksheet it proposed to deal with the first two dies only on which most of the ld red plates appear.

Die I G W R 10,13,11 Both dies reported by Mr Jennings but not Die II G W R 10,16,11 seen by the Editor. The major difference (perhaps only difference) between this and

Die II is that the outer strokes of the W consist of 4 holes in Die 1 and 5 holes in Die II. There is, however, a third hole missing which presumably is the one numbered '2'in the enlarged facsimile of the W from Die 11 shown alongside. It can be seen that three holes numbered 1, 2 & 3 could be omitted without it being noticed.

All this, of course, is only supposition but is mentioned so that members who hold any of Die I can check and advise us whether all other holes in die II match those in die I. The information given by Mr Jennings certainly indicates that two separate dies existed, Die 1 being the first to disappear although they seem to have been in simultaneous use for a long period.
