Identities Catalogue

It has been pointed out by one of our members that in many cases the identities given in the catalogue may be incorrect, having been innocently guessed at. He has suggested that the catalogue be split into two parts,

Section A - Certified positive identities.

Section B - Uncertified perfins known to exist and whose identity is believed to be as stated.

Section A should only be included after an entire (envelope postcard, wrapper etc.,) bearing the perfin and the printed or embossed name of the user has been submitted to the Society for verification. A photo-copy of the front and back should be taken for the Society's Records and attached thereto a certificate giving

fullest possible details of the perforations applied to the stamps. This would give a hall mark to a perfin equivalent to a B.P.A. certificate. Items would only be included in Section A after the most searching examination.

As we have already started to bring out a new edition of the Catalogue, it is suggested that instead of two sections, we add the certificate number after the identity in cases where one can be issued.

Comments on the above are requested and should be sent direct to me. (i.e. the Catalogue Editor)

ILLUSTRATED PERFIN CATALOGUE: (Czechoslovakian)

Dr Tilles has given us a few more details of the Czechoslovakian perfins catalogue mentioned in our last issue.

It is printed by the offset litho process and contains 30 pages with illustrations and technical information including the place of origin and the name of the company using the die.

The catalogue also contains dies used by companies in Hungary, Austria and Bohemia & Moravia that were associated with Czechoslovakia.

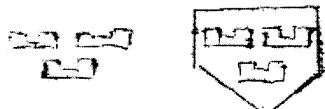

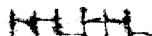



S.E.P.S. EXCHANGE PACKET RULES

1. The packet shall circulate amongst those members of the S.E.P.S who have advised the Packet Superintendent that they wish to receive it.
2. Members may contribute to the Packet whether they wish to receive it or not. Non-members may contribute only at the discretion of the Packet Superintendent.
3. The Packet Superintendent reserves the right to decline any application for membership, or to remove any names from the list of members receiving packets, without having to state the reason.
4. Neither the Packet Superintendent nor the S.E.P.S. will be held responsible for any letters, packets, or stamps, lost or damaged in transit; or for any loss occasioned by defalcation, bankruptcy, or death of any member; or for any debts of members.
5. Members are solely responsible for packets whilst in their possession.
6. Upon receipt, members must check the number of booklets and their contents to see that there are no discrepancies. Any irregularities must be notified to the Packet Superintendent giving full details. Failure to do so may result in the member being charged for the items.
7. Purchases must be signed for in ink or by using a rubber stamp, the total value being entered on the front cover of the booklet and on the advice slip. DO NOT sign with initials only as this is apt to cause confusion. Pressure from signatures, especially in ball point pen, can cause damage to stamps on the following pages. Please exercise care or insert a sheet of thin card between the pages when signing.
8. An advice slip must be completed, even in the event of no purchases, and sent with a receipt of posting and any remittance to the Packet Superintendent on the same day as the packet is posted. If a packet is passed by hand, a receipt must be obtained on the reverse of the advice slip. No registration is required unless stipulated on any specific packet. The packets must bear no indication of their contents on the wrappers.
9. All cheques and postal orders should be crossed and made out to the S.E.P.S.
10. Packets must be passed on within three days of receipt (Sundays and Bank Holidays excepted). Members who are likely to be away from home for more than a few days should advise the Packet Superintendent in ample time to allow any packets to be diverted.
11. Any remarks calling attention to unsigned spaces, items wrongly described, etc., must be signed by the person making them. Members should not apply ticks or other marks to the booklets.
12. No booklet may be removed from or added to the packet during circulation. Any member wishing to remove an item from his own booklet must sign to that effect as in the case of a normal purchase.
13. A commission of 10% will be charged on all sales.

For Contributors

22. Unsold material and/or remittances from sales will be returned to the vendor by letter post unless otherwise directed. Return postage will be paid by the vendor.

A purchaser not in agreement with the description of any material should refer the matter to the vendor through the Packet Superintendent.
