It is a great pleasure to report that the Society's funds are in a healthier state this year, and that a surplus of £37 for the year has been achieved. The prospects for the coming year are not quite so good since our stocks of publications are becoming low.

Your Committee has decided to "invest" in 50 Premium Bonds, as is permitted by the Society's rules. This has been done in order to reduce the Society's cash balances to a lower level, which will still leave ample funds for paying the coming year's expenses and for the printing of the railway perfins book.

Membership at 31st August, 1972, stood at 106, a net decrease of 4 for the year.

It would be gratefully appreciated if members remember the following when making remittances:

- a) Remittances, other than annual subscriptions, will not be acknowledged unless requested.
- b) All cheques and postal orders should be made payable to the Society and not to individual officers.
- c) Members in the U.K. should only make remittances by stamps for amounts of 5p or under.
- d) Members who live overseas are asked to send bank notes where possible or, failing that, international money orders when making payments to the Society. Those in the U.S.A, who send cheques must expect to bear a substantial collection charge, which is likely to be as much as 30p per cheque. This charge is made on the Society by deduction from the proceeds of the cheque, so that all those members in the U.S.A., who wish to pay by cheque, must allow for this bank charge when making payments in this way. The Society's bank has also introduced a commission of 5p on cashing bank notes.

It now remains for me to thank the Officers and Committee for their support during the year, and to thank Ron Bowman in particular for his invaluable assistance.

Worksheet No.2 noted only one die as being used by this Company and quoted it as being the same as Cat. No. 641.1. The few examples given in the Worksheet were from the writer's own collection, and a further check shows these to be not as 641.1 but as Die 1 below.

Several members reported holding examples of the Caledonian Railway perfin but did not query the size and number of holes.
