3. Review

Canadian Postage Stamps Perforated and Overprinted OHMS & G 5th Edition by Roy Wrigley.

Published in 1972 by the author in Canada and available from Harris Publications at £1.65 post free.

This is a priced catalogue and handbook of all Canadian Official perfins including major and minor varieties. It is indispensable for anyone even vaguely interested in Canadian perfins.

Prices for early perfins will astound many members, eg. S.G. 244 @ \$1.50 - based on auction realisation. Fully illustrated this book sets an excellent example.

The November-December copy of the American Perfins Bulletin put out a worksheet on Belgium perfins. If anyone collects the perfins of Belgium and feel that they may have something to add, the Editor has a copy which he would be pleased to let them borrow.

LINE ENGRAVED

With this issue we start a listing of line engraved perfins prepared by Mr K. Rymer Young. The whole list will comprise some 7 - 8 pages and we shall attempt to complete the publication in the next two or three issues.

The final page will contain the explanatory notes but it may be as well to explain right now that N1, N2 etc., indicate dies hitherto completely unrecorded or not previously recorded on line engraved issues.

Mr Young is certainly adding to our fund of knowledge - a goodly part of the new identities recorded nowadays are due to him - and we would like to express our appreciation of the material he supplies.

FRENCH PERFINS

Mr Hewlett has brought to our attention a booklet on French perfins entitled, "Les Timbres Francais Perfores., Edite par Le Monde des Philatelistes Study No. 97 by Colonel Lebland.

The book contains all the known perfins of France, Monaco, Saar and French Colonies. There are 32 pages which are copiously illustrated.

Mr Hewlett obtained his copy in France priced 8Fr, about 75p. We know that other members have copies of this publication and we wonder whether it can be purchased in this country, and at what price. Does anyone know?

FUTURE MATERIAL

We seem to be relatively well set up at the moment for material for future bulletins. We have the remainder of Mr Young's listing and the promise of more to come, a few pages from Miss M.E Thornton on perforated postcards and envelopes plus the remaining pages of the Officils Catalogue.

It appears that two dies existed, the earlier measuring 9½mm to 10½mm wide, and the later die 7½mm wide.

The change of die seems to have occurred in 1941 so that the wider die may well have been destroyed when Slopers were bombed. If this is the case then one could perhaps expect to find Sloper "Provisionals". Has anyone seen examples of the LT perfin where the L and the T have obviously been perforated in separate passes through a machine?

In order-to narrow down the period during which the change could have occurred, would members please check their LT perfins on KGV1 stamps and report as under. Negative answers are as helpful as positive ones, as will be any dates.
