FUTURE MATERIAL

A few members have written in expressing agreement with the two projects mentioned in our last issue, fullnames and shipping companies. It is proposed, therefore to start issuing worksheets for both projects concurrently.

As with the Railway Perfins, the Worksheets will contain such information as is known to the Editor. Members are

Any person sending booklets for circulation can have them insured for 2p for each £1 or part of £1 value of the booklets. In the event of loss or theft, the vendor shall receive the value of the material less 10% commission and 2p in the pound insurance.

Booklets will not be insured unless requested in a covering letter when they are submitted. The insurance premium may be remitted with the request for insurance or it may be left for the Packet Superintendent to deduct from sales.

Owners of uninsured booklets will not be entitled to compensation.

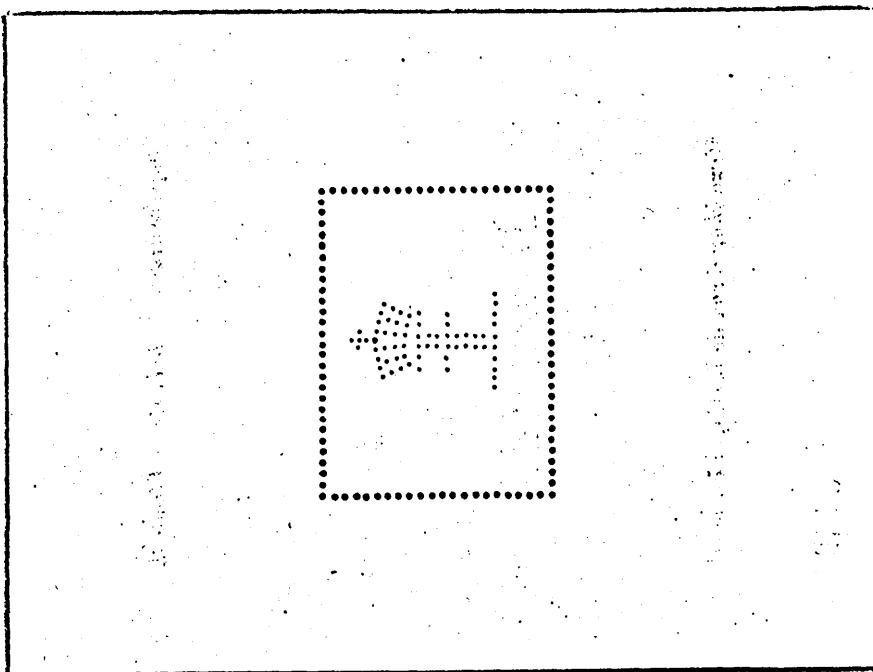

I have a copy of this stamp in a miniature sheet, perforated with a crown over the Queen's monogram, as shown in the illustration. The basic sheet is listed as MS C308b in Gibbons' "Europe 1". MS C308c which follows the basic sheet, is described as being "As last with perforated crown and monogram with violet control number on back". My sheet has only the red control number 043628 on the front in the lower right hand corner.

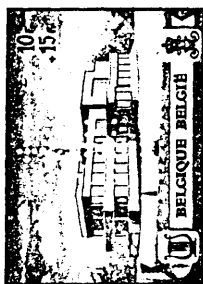
Michel Katalog Europa 1968 lists the basic sheet as numbers 594 and 595 (Imperforate and perforated, respectively.) Following the basic sheets is a note which I have translated freely as follows:

The remainders of No. 594 and 595 were perforated by the organisers of the Music Hall with a crown and the double letters **3E** they were also overprinted, No. 594 in black and 595 in red, with consecutive numbers on the lower edge.

Two specialised Belgian catalogues I have, just list the perforated sheets as private souvenir issues. They are, therefore, not Perfins in the usual sense of the word since the perforations were presumably applied to prevent postal use of the stamps should they be removed from the sheet.



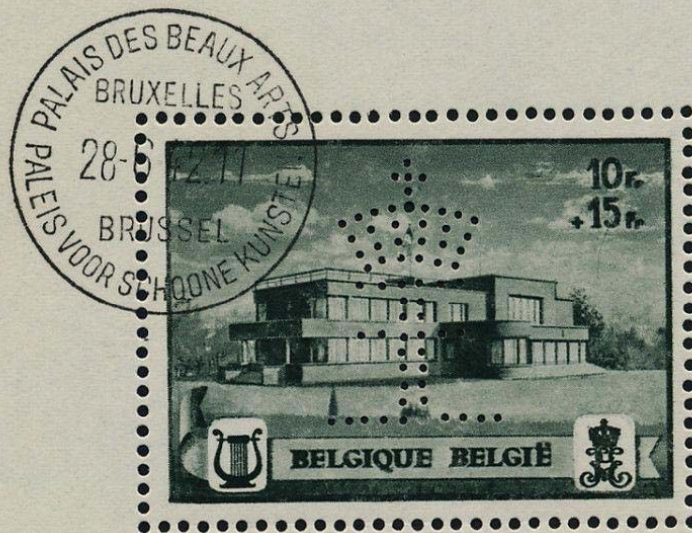
