COMMEMORATIVE PERFIN

Miss M.E. Thornton.

E.I.P.A.30

EXPOSITION INTERNATIONALE DE LA POSTE  
AERIENNE, PARIS 30

This Exhibition was held at the Grand Palais,  
from November 6th to 20th 1930.

The organisers asked for a special stamp for the occasion. The request was granted, and they were allowed to use a stamp which had been issued earlier in the year, on June 8th, but in a different colour. This stamp was the first that France had issued specially for airmail use (S.G. 483). It was designed by Albert Laurens and engraved by Abel Mignon, the colour being lake and the value 1F 50 (50c for a letter of 10gm. and 1F airmail fee). The stamp was issued at the time of the Aviation Meeting at Vincennes.

The stamp for the Paris Exhibition was the same value, but was printed in blue. It was first sold exclusively at the Exhibition for 6F 50, which included the entrance fee. On November 11th it was decided to perforate the stamps with "E.I.P.A.30", this procedure being authorised by the French President, Gaston Doumergue. It appears that the stamps were folded and perforated in sets of four, and so they are to be found normal, inverted, reversed and inverted reversed.

Later, a great many more of the blue stamps were printed up to April 1932, and so the perforation distinguishes those actually sold at the Exhibition, and they are now expensive items. In a 1959 Yvert catalogue the stamp with perforation was priced at 5500 old francs. In a more recent Auction Sale catalogue in G.B. the estimated price was given as £30.

It is said that 125 of the 1F 50 lake stamps were also perforated, though it is doubtful if they were allowed to circulate.

A note in Stanley Gibbons Part One, says: "No. 484 (the blue stamp) was originally sold exclusively at the international Aero-Philatelic Exhibition, Paris, at 6F 50 including the entrance fee, but it was reissued at face value in 1931" No mention is made of the perforation on the stamp.

Yvert catalogue says: "Le No. 6a (outremer) fut émis a l'occasion cue l'Exposition internationale de la Poste Aérienne, à Paris; pendant la durée de celle-ci un certain nombre d'exemplaires ont été perforés comme ci-dessous." An illustration of the perfin is given.

In writing these notes reference has been made to the interesting article by R. Marsh-Feiley, "A Few French Airmail Curiosities" published in "Stamp Collecting" January 13th 1972.
