COMMEMORATIVE PERFINS

Jack Brandt of Canada sends details of an Italian perfin he has which is illustrated alongside.



He has this on the 25 lire value of the 1945-46 air set off cover and on a pair of the 2 lire denomination of the same set on cover. The envelope has a printed cachet with design and printing giving the words "RIVNIONE FILATELICA PRIMAVERILE VENEIANA, 4.5.6 Maggio 1946. It has a handstamped cachet with similar wording and is postmarked Venezia, May 4 1946.

Jack also says that he has heard of a commemorative from Sweden perforated TRBG70, and used in Trelleborg.

If anyone can add any further information to either of these perfins we shall be pleased to hear from them.

PERFINS OF THOMAS COOK & SON, LIMITED

The Society's catalogue lists 3 dies for Thomas Cook & Son. I have a new die to add, and some possibles, I also list some perfins from other countries which may have been used by this firm.

Mr C. Jennings and Mr K. Rymer Young list a die in their catalogue of Line Engraved Stamps, but it is unidentified.

<u>Possible</u>	T.C/&S TC/&S 7,8/12,10	on 1d red, plate 179. I have this on Q.V. 1880-83 2½d blue, plate 23 and 2½d Jubilee issue.
<u>Cat No.110.4</u>	TC/&S 7,8/14,10	I have this on, K.E.VII. 1d, 1½d, 2d, 3d. There are two settings of this die - the "TC" being in a slightly different position in relation to the "&S". The following stamps are little different from those above, K.G.V. ½d, 2d, 3d, (Cypher) 4d, 6d (Block)
<u>Possible :</u>	As 110.4 but with letters a little smaller. I have, Q.V. 1d Lilac, Jubilee ½d Orange, 1½d, 2d 2½d. K.E.VII 1d.	
<u>Cat No 110.2</u>	TC/&S 6,7/12,9	I have this on, K.G.V 1934-36 4d K.G.VI ½d dark. 3d dark
<u>New Identity</u>	TC/S 10,10/11	I have this on, K.G.V. 1½d (Block). K.G.VI. 1½d brown. 2½d blue used on piece dated 11 Oct 1946 and containing name of user - Thomas Cook & Son Ltd, Head Office Berkley Street, Picadilly, London, W.1.
Cat No. 76.1	TC 6,7 4½	The Catalogue records that this perfin is also used by other concerns so identification is more difficult I have it on, Q.E. 2d (receipt use).





COMMEMORATIVE PERFIN

EXHIBITION OF PHOTOGRAPHY, LENINGRAD

The information about this perfin comes from Mr B. Pritt who provided the covers illustrated on the following two pages. (Illustrations produced by Brian Birch). In this case it is ENVELOPES and POSTCARDS with perforations and not the stamps.

The covers were issued and cancelled at an Exhibition of Photography, held in the Museum of Communications, and dedicated to the name of Popov in Leningrad. Mr Pritt says that all covers issued at this Exhibition were perforated with the same post horn emblem.
