SECURITY ENDORSEMENTS OF SWEDEN By Mike J. Burrows

In 1872 the contract-for printing all Swedish stamps was in the hands of the manager of a printing concern responsible for the bank-note production of the National Bank, Pehr Olof Bagge. His death saw the contract transferred to Jacob Bagge in February 1873.

It would seem that Jacob was a very unhappy fellow and, by the end of 1885, he had so attacked the postal officials over the quality of the paper that was being sanctioned for postage stamps, that the Government of the day was asked to let Bagge have the chance to use products other than the hand-made paper produced by the National Bank's mill at Tumba. This request was granted, but in order to have a security check, it was necessary to have some form of stock control. This control took the form of printing blue posthorns on the posthorns on the back of sheets in positions to give 200 impressions that fell one on each stamp (when printed) in the lower third of the design.

Although the public were able to buy the stamps in sheets of 100, they were printed in sheets of 200 which were divided. Two plates of 100 posthorn devices were made. These plates marked 1 & 2 were probably put side by side indiscriminately when being used. In the margins 8 larger posthorns appear. A further control was the addition of a number and letter on the left hand upper margin put on by a numbering machine.

The first delivery of machine made paper was made on 13th February 1886. It is believed that most of the machine made paper came from Gebruder Hoesch, Maschinenpapier Fa.brik, Kreuzau bei Duren.

It will be seen that machine made paper was security endorsed by printing the blue posthorns on the back by the Post Office. The stamp design being printed by Bagge. Whether any of this so called "posthorn series" are known with commercial perfins, I do not know. Perhaps some of our members have examples of this government security endorsement with privately made perfins? Also does anyone have the date of introduction of perfins in Sweden?

0040 Revenues

Brandt J.

Perfins Bulletin, Oct. 1973. 26, (9), 8.

Perfins which are quite rare on postage stamps may be very common on revenue stamps. It is possible that many companies had two perforators one for postal issues and one for revenues. The patterns would be basically the same but differing in minor details, spacing etc. In a rush, it could be that a few postage stamps would be perforated on the revenue machine thus creating a scarse pattern which is quite common on revenues (complete).

0041 "O.U.S." and Similar Overprints on Stamps Used
by Certain Business Firms McGowan B.
British Philatelist. June 1926, 19, (4), 27-30;
July 1926, 19, (5), 35-40; Aug. 1926, 19, (6),
47-48; Dec. 1926, 19, (10), 79-80; April 1927,
20, (2), 14-16.

In 1959 the O.U.S. obtained permission to have its initials printed on the face of British postage stamps. In 1869 the Society was informed that the overprinting could only be done on the backs of the stamps. Permission was withdrawn in 1882 only to be allowed again in 1903 and overprints were still being used in 1915 by one firm. A comprehensive list of overprints and the stamps on which they may be found is included. Embossing has also been used to protect stamps and five users of this process are noted.

0042 The "Holloway 244" Overprint Ward G.

British Philatelist, Aug. 1926, 19, (6), 45-46. This overprint was used by Thomas Holloway, proprietor of Holloway's Pills and Ointment of 244, Strand, London. Correspondence with the firm brought forth the information that a running stock of stamps value about £2,000 was kept at the time of the overprinting. In spite of this, the author can only describe four stamps so overprinted.

0043 'Mounting perfins

Travail W.

Perfins, Nov. 1945, 3, (4), 1-2.

The use of block pages or suall_ black rectangles for individual stamps is recommended for displaying perfins where the collector wants to mount his perfins face up. The perfin design can be pricked in the page margin using one of the perfins as a stencil.

0044 British Stamps Perforated with Firms' Initials (S.P.I.F.S.)

Vallancey F. H.

2nd Edition. Pub. F. Hugh Vallancey, Sidcup, Kent. 1948

A short history Of the adoption of perfins for protecting stamps, made very effective by the use of correspondence to and from Joseph Sloper. Mr. Vallancey was allowed access to the records of J. Sloper & Co. Ltd. and also to the list of users of perfins supplied by the firm. It is thought that Sloper's archives were subsequently destroyed during the war.

0045 Mounting Perfins

Metzs C. V.

Perfins, Nov. 1945, 1, (4), 2.

Mr. Metzs explains his own method of mounting perfins on specially drawn pages. The design is picked out, using a sharp pencil, in the upper corner of the page and subsequently inked in. Each stamp is mounted on a small square of black paper and mounted opposite the inked pattern.

0046 The Australian Commonwealth Specialists
Catalogue 1969

13th Edition. Hawthorn Press, Melbourne 1969
The catalogue lists those stamps perforated OS
which were used by the federal (as opposed to State)
departments. Each stamp is considered individually
by face value in all its watermark and perforation
varieties. Prices are given for both mint and used OS

They were not for sale in mint, condition and were available to the public only after being cancelled with a parcel post rotary canceller reading BALBOA HEIGHTS, CANAL ZONE between two wavy lines. However, the 2c exists without this cancellation. Also known with inverted 'P'. The perf. 'P' stamps are very scarse (complete.)
