#### COLLECTING FERFINS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA

#### By Vojtech Maxa

There has been a Group of perfin collectors in Czechoslovakia since June 1974. By the end of 1975 it had over 120 members and was publishing its own bulletin called, 'Zaprovdaj Perfiny' (Perfins Bulletin). The following is a brief outline of the Group ts origin and its activities.

I alone have to accept responsibility for introducing perfin collecting into my country and for organising the Group. It all started 10 years ago......

One of my philatelic interests is Poland - a deeply specialised study of two stamps, namely the 50 gr. Pilsudpki and the 1zl. Moscieki, issued in 1928-35, I subscribed to a Polish stamp journal and once, when I worked as a Correspondent of the Czechoslovak News Agency CETERA in Lagos, Nigeria, I came across an article written by Mr. Alexander Sekowski from Warsaw. He described polish perfins - some fifty different types -, giving the catalogue numbers of stamps on which he found particular dies. I saw that perfins appeared also on "my" two Polish stamps and decided to include them in my collection. I entered into correspondence with Mr Sekowski and received from him two Polish perfins on the 50 gr. Pilsudeki stamp.

In early 1969, after I had returned home, I visited Mr Sekowski in Warsaw Where I saw his splendid collection and discussed perfin collecting with him. When we took leave, he handed me a small envelope containing some stamps and said, "Look Mr. Maxa, here are thirteen Czechoslovakian perfins for a start, why don't you try to study the perfins of your own country?"

Not having the slightest idea of what faced me, I accepted. Later on, when I was back in Prague, I came across a copy of Linn's Stamp Weekly with many articles on perfins. There I learned that some 500 Danish perfins were known and reasoned (how naively!) that if there are less than 100 in Poland and 500 in Denmark, my country's score would be somewhere in between - a mere couple of hundred. I also learned that Mr John S. Nelson had published a booklet dealing with the history of British perfins, I wrote to him, and he not only kindly sent me a copy of his book, but also a listing of his Czechoslovakian perfins,

And so, step by step, I was able to assemble information about some 75 different Czech perfins. Soon I realised that it is very important to know who was using them. I enquired at the Postal Museum hoping that the use of perfins was authorised individually as are meter-mail patterns. I even tried the Patent Office only to find out that perfins were not regarded as Trade Marks and no record was kept of them.

All this made it clear to me that the study of Czechoslovakian perfins would require original and difficult research. In spite of this difficulty, I made a decision to compile a catalogue of them.

I entered into correspondence with officers and members of the U.S. Perfins Club and later became a member of it. They were very helpful and kindly sent me lots of valuable information on Czechoslovakian perfins.

In June 1970 the Czechoslovak stamp journal "Filatelie" published my article "Uninteresting & Valueless?", in which I wrote about perfins generally and about Czechoslovakian perfins in particular, giving a list of the 75 I already knew.

That started it. In the space of three months I was flooded with letters from stamp collectors from all parts of the country. Some writers sent me a few perfins, others hundreds and more. Many of them admitted that although they knew very well (all the philatelic authorities kept telling them) that perfinned stamps (or stamps with holes as they used to call them) should be discard -ed as valueless and unfit for collecting, they long ago put them aside for a rainy day. In the twelve months following the publication of the first article I was able to record about 500 perfins from Czechoslovakian territory.

A slight digression should be allowed here. I use the term "perfins from the Czechoslovakian territory" and not "Czechoslovakian perfins" with good reason. My country was part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire for three hundred years, and only as recently as October 28th 1918 did we become independent. Firms doing their business in the Czech lands from 1880 to 1918 used Austrian stamps, while those in Slovakia (eastern part of the Repulic) used Hungarian stamps. In October 1938 parts of our territory were incorporated into the German Reich, other parts went to Hungary and Poland. Of the remaining land, two separate political units were formed in March 1939 - the Protectorate of Bohemia & Moravia and the Slovak state.

So, many of the old perfin patterns, originating before 1918, appeared on the stamps of different postal authorities according to the complicated and dramatic development of our history.

Incidently, this fact makes the study of our perfins very fascinating.

Great help also came to me from abroad, not only British and American perfin collectors helped me, but also those from the Netherlands, Canada and Western Germany.

Following this initial success, I published more articles on our perfins in the philatelic press. Among them was one with the text of the original document authorising the use of perfins in Austria, which I discovered. It is dated April 4th 1877 and was published in the Austrian Post-Office Gazette. This decree was taken over, with many others, by the Czechoslovakian Authorities in 1918. Surpaisingly, it was never recalled and, therefore, it is still legal to use perfins in Czechoslovakia.

With the generous help of so many collectors from home and abroad (their total number must be well over fifty!) my work on the catalogue progressed quite swiftly. I negociated its publication with the U.S. Perfins Club, and thanks to the friendly help and encouragement of it's officers, the catalogue was published in June 1972.

This catalogue contains some 700 perfins (all fully illustrated) with slightly over 40% of the perfin users identified. Another point here; when identifying a perfin owner I always add the sort of business he is engaged in. I think that it enhances the interest of a perfin collection and helps those philatelists who collect perfins thematically.

0116 Patterns and Issues Travell W.

Perfins, July 1947, 3. (3), 1

Every Trade, sport, etc. has to establish its own set of terms with its special meanings. The term "pattern" is suggested to denote the arrangement of holes in a perfin. Also collecting by "issue" means a particular perfin on every different stamp (neglecting watermarks, shades etc.) whilst collecting by "type" means only one or two copies of each perfin pattern irrespective of the stamp it is found upon.

0117 Types, Designs & Varieties Travell W.

Perfins, July 1947, 3, (3), 2

In an effort to promote uniform terminology relating to perfins, the author suggests standard definitions for several perfin-related words - Perfins; Type; Design & Varieties.

0118 Check List of Canadian Stamps perforated "O.H.M.S."
Maple Leaves Booklet No. 1., Canadian Philatelic
Society of Great Britain, c. 1949, pp-6

One of the earliest checklists of the O.H.M.S. perfins of Canada. It lists a modest (by Wrigley standards) 134 stamps, thus perforated, and gives the positions known but no prices.

0119 Numbers Please

Maxa V.

Perfins Bull., Mar. 1976, 29, (3), 3

Generally, perfins with numbers on them give little help to those wishing to identify their user unless the significance of the number is easily recognisable. 1842 on Czech stamps was used by the Pilsner Urquelle Brewery, established in 1842. However the significance of 16/5/06 on £10 British South Africa stamp (possibly a date) or C02 on Hungarian stamps (perhaps the formula for carbon dioxide) still eludes us.

0120 U.S. Postal Agency, Shanghai, China McHenry G.

Perfins Bull., Mar. 1976,  $\underline{29}$ , (3), 4

The author has a postcard Tanked with a one cent U.S. parcel post stamp, tied by a 1914 - U.S. Postal Agency, Shanghai, China cancel and bearing a B.A.T./Co. Ld perfin of the British American Tobacco Co. Ltd. The message on the card indicates private use. This perfin is also known on the stamps of Great Britain, China and Japan. (complete)

0121 Rouletted perfin on French cover(\*)
Kloss B.

Perfins Bull., Mar. 1976, 29, (3), 4

Not all perfins are composed of round holes. A French cover is shown which has a stamp perforated G. MINI by means of a double row of slits.

0122 Faroese Perfins

Baker J.H.

Perfins Bull., Mar. 1976, 29, (3), 5

The Faroe Islands, whose first stamps were only issued in Jan. 1975, already have a perfin in use. P.F. Valdemar Lutzen, a department store in Torshaven uses the perfin V.L.

0123 Jim Harris's Perfins

Harris J.

Perfins Bull., Mar. 1976, 29, (3), 5

Jim Harris has two or three perfins - depending on how you look at it. JH (USA - J 55.7) is home made whilst the other which perforates HAR/RIS is store bought. The latter is made to perforate two se-tenant definitive size stamps at once, one with HAR (USA - H 21.5) and the other RIS (USA - R 94.5)

0124 New Schermack discovery?

Schoeps C.

Perfins Bull., Mar. 1976, 29, (3), 6

A type III Schermack with perfin No. 5 is shown on a 1906, 2c Imperforate (Scott No. 320) Whilst this type of Schermack is not uncommon on this stamp, it has not been seen before with this perfin. The perfin in question is in the form of the usual Schermack nine pin square but with the centre hole missing.

0125 Perfins of Western Australia

Pocock D.A.

SEPS, 1975, pp-2

Apart from the well known OS and WA perfins, the author lists 13 belonging to private companies (8 identified) and the P.W.D. - Public Works Department, official. Two more tentative identifications are added as a "stop press".

0126 Perfins on the U.S. offset printing issue; Part 5 Bennett D.

Perfins Bull., Mar. 1976, 29, (3), 7

The fifth instalment of this series; covering the perfins beginning with F, G and H.

O127 Canadian stamps with perforated Initials
British North America Philatelic Society, Toronto,
1955, pp-32.

First edition of the B.N.A.P.S, catalogue of Canadian perfins. Same format as the latest (3rd) edition but with no rarity factor.

0128 Bousted and Company

Bosley J.W.

SEPS, 1976, pp.1

Early issues of Straits Settlements can commonly be found with the manuscript security endorsement B & Co of Bousted and Company. Within a couple of years (around 1870) the manuscript was replaced by a rubber stamp which was itself replaced by a perforator about 1895. Straits Settlement stamps overprinted B for use in Bangkok can also

be found with the manuscript B & Co from supplies returned to Singapore when the Bangkok office was closed.

0129 The Great Western Railway in Ireland Burrows M.

SEPS, 1976, pp.3

A concise account of the Great Western Railway's interests in Ireland, particularly in relation to its fleet of ferries. Details are given of all the ferries operated by G.W.R. and the fates of many are also noted. Checklists of G.W.R. and RE/WR (Railway Executive Western Region) perfins on British and Irish stamps are included.

0130 The Handbook of British Perfins Nelson J.S.

John Nelson, Biggin Hill, 1967, pp.30

A concise history of the origin and use of security endorsements (particularly perfins) in the U.K. The product of much original research, it contains several illustrations of original documents and a wealth of interesting anecdotes. Copiously illustrated.

0131 Relative ratings of U.S. perfins Cain C.W.

Perfins Club, pp.21

These widely quoted "Cain Ratings" divide all U.S. perfins (listed by catalogue number) into five grades, A to E, according to relative rarity.

0132 What are perfins?

Maxa V.

Perfins Bull., Apr. 1976, 29, (4), 1-2

Although appearing to be an attempt to define the criteria which dictate whether a stamp which has been punched or perforated may be called a perfin, this article is mostly concerned with classifying the various groups and sub-groups of perfins and users.

0133 Perfins of U. S. companies abroad; part 3 Prins J.

Perfins Bull., Apr. 1976, <u>29</u>, (4), 3-4

The third instalment  $inclu \overline{Zre}$ 's a large section on the Vacuum oil Co (found on the stamps of 18 countries) and a range of other companies from General Motors to Esso.

0134 Perfins of China

Tilles H.

Harvey Tilles, High Point, U.S.A. 1975, pp.6

Apart from a short introduction detailing the introduction of and regulations regarding perfins in China, this book consists of illustrations of all the known perfins of China and Kiantschou. Most of the perfin users are identified and the area of use is noted. The complete absence of any explanatory notes regarding the entries under "France" and "Germany" hinders appreciation of their significance.

0135 My perfin entry: Stampex 1975 Wright N.

A short description of the exhibit which won the author a bronze medal at stampex in 1975. The entry was a review of the history of perfins using British and Irish perfins.

0136 The S.E.P.S. Perfin

Birch B.J. & Bowman R.

SEPS Bull., July/Aug. 1975, (158), 3 & 6.

The Society's perforator and die (SEP/S) are shown. It was purchased by Chris Carr and John Nelson on behalf of the Society in 1964 from Baddeley Brothers for £9.15s. (£9.75).

0137 A German Stamp perforated "Tokio 1964" Hornung O.

SEPS Bull., July/Aug, 1975, (158), 5

The Illustrated encyclopaedia of Stamp Collecting, Hamlyn, London, 1970, pp. 82-83

A group of dealers in West Germany bought a large quantity of sets of the official stamps for the Olympic Games in Tokio. They had them perforated "Tokio 1964", had some postmarked in Bonn on first day covers and obtained a declaration from an official of the German Olympic Committee authorising them to issue the set. They then sold the stamps from Liechtenstein at a profit of about 400,000 D.M. (about £40,000). (Complete.)

0138 British perfins on revenue stamps (\*) Schwerdt R. & Tennant C.P.

SEPS Bull., Sept./Oct. 1975, (159), 4

The perfins of various banks can be found on British revenue stamps (Foreign Bill, Land Registry, Judicature, etc.) Examples of such perfins are B.B. - Baring Brothers & Co. Ltd.; C.B. - Colonial Bank; C.B.I.-- Chartered Bank of India; C.L. - Credit Lyonnaise and I.B.H.L. - International Bank of London.

0139 Perfins of the Middle East Tilles H.

Harvey Tilles, High Point, U.S.A., 1975, PP.12
Only six countries in the Middle East appear to have issued perfins:- Egypt (32), Lebanon (2), Palestine (4), Persia (3), Sudan (7) and Turkey (22), and very little information regarding their authorisation is available. Many perfins of Egypt, Palestine and Turkey are also found on the stamps of the various foreign powers who had post offices in these areas (Britain, Austria, France, Germany, Italy and Russia).

O140 To members of the Perfins Society Persans F.F.

Perfin., Feb. 1948, 3, (5), 1

Alongside a general collection of 40,000 stamps, the author has a perfin collection containing almost 2,500
