CLOSED ALBUM

We recently learned from Floyd Walker of the American Perfins Club that Al Bartleson (reported as lapsed in our last issue) died as long ago as September 1977.

Al was one of our founder members (No. F.3.) and although we did not get much correspondence from him in recent years his membership subscription was always paid up in advance. It was not until 1978 that his subs finally ran out, and receiving no reply to our reminders, we regretfully had to treat him as lapsed.

It seems that he never married and had no close family so his will specified that his perfins collection be donated to the American Perfins Club to be used as the Club chose. The Club chose to sell the collection (over 1 ton of material) through its own auctions and sales department. The funds to be used to finance a revision of the United States Perfins Catalogue, which will be

dedicated to Al Bartleson when published later this year. Several thousand dollars have already been raised (the British main collection brought \$2,700) and there is still a lot of material to be offered so we are told.

THE YOST TYPEWRITER COMPANY

It is believed that G.W.N. Yost, one of the protagonists of the typewriter, gave his name to this company which was established prior to 1891, the date of its incorporation as a limited liability company.

Very soon after its inception the Company had opened either offices or agencies in many towns and cities.

Two dies have been definitely identified (with three other probables) as belonging to this popular (in its day) typewriter manufactory. A company which must have produced a very greatly appreciated product to have won no less than twenty eight gold medals by the 1920's, and Royal Warrants to four members of the Royal Family.

In the middle of the 1920's the head office was given as 50, Holborn Viaduct, with works premises at 45 & 47 Farringdon Road.



90 new perfin patterns are illustrated and more than 80 identities are included in this supplement together with a large number of corrections and additions.

0356 French issues - Vol. 3 - The perforated stamps of France (second, third and fourth lists)
Lebland
Study No. 97, Le Monde des Philatelistes, Paris, 1968 (S.E.P.S. Trans. 8)
Originally published separately in Le Monde des Philatelistes, the first three supplements to Colonel Lebland's list of French perfins are gathered together (not compiled into a single list) into a pamphlet. The translation covers the few pieces of text and includes a complete French-English vocabulary (including only those French words found in the listings) to facilitate use of the lists.

0357 Perfinned and Underprinted
Hempsall M.
SEPS Bull., Sept./Oct. 1978, (177), 3-4
Amongst a number of Victorian stamps perfinned C/(box)/HC was one bearing the underprint "Copestake/Moore/Crampton & Co.,/LONDON : It is thought that the perfin was ordered at the time the Company's name changed to "Copestake Hughes, Crampton & Co" and that the box was intended to obliterate the word Moore. Other perfins from the same company were found, one being similar to the above but with a hole missing from the box (possibly a branch identification?) and the other C/-/H.C

0358 Cheque perforator Day P.G.
SEPS Bull., Sept./Oct. 1978, (177), 4
A perforator is described which is considered to be a cheque perforator rather than one for perforating stamps since the die (PS&S - monogram) is too wide for a normal size definitive.

The Royal Niger Company established the Burutu Post Office in 1896, the town of Burutu being on the Niger river. Various stamps from Great Britain are known postmarked Burutu bearing the C.M.S. perfin of the Christian Missionary Society. Similar usage has already been noted at Akassa.

0360 CE 2 perfins

The Airmail special Delivery stamps of the United States. The Bureau Issues Association, Arlington, 1977, pp.80-81

Twelve perfins are listed as appearing on the 1934 Air Mail Special Delivery stamp. Eleven of the twelve are illustrated, all but one with its user identified.

Various Swiss perfins are listed with some illustrated. The earliest Swiss perfin is said to be G.V of Gebruder Volkart but other tentative identifications given are rather dubious.

The 35th anniversary of the Perfins Club was celebrated by producing a special cover bearing the VAPEX perfin (a lighthouse design), franked with a postmark showing the perfin.

When trying to rationalise a postmarked perfin, it may sometimes be observed that the postmark does not appear to be the correct or normal usage for a particular firm. The Post Office's Cash on Delivery scheme can be the cause of such confusion and its operation and consequences are outlined by means of the items bearing stamps perforated S/&Co of Selfridges.

0364 Background on U.S. perfin users

Perfins Bull., Oct. 1978, 31, (9), 4

The Portland Traction Company opened its first railway line in 1893. By 1906, and after various mergers, the company became known as the Portland Railway, Light and Power Company, using the perfin PR/LP. In 1924, the company was renamed Portland Electric Power Company, giving the perfin a maximum life of 18 years. Elbert Hubbard's perfin consists of a circle surmounted by a 3-armed cross, a symbol first used by Cassiodorces, a book binder from the Middle Ages. Following Hubbard's death in 1915, the perfin was used by the Roycroft Shop in East Aurora, N.J.

Three different perfins have been used by the Danish
State Railway, all featuring the initials DSB but of different
sizes. The Danish State's first lines were taken over in
1867 from a private railway company. DSB perfins can be
found on their own railway freight stamps as well as postage
stamps and private railway freight stamps.

Perfins Bull., Oct. 1978, 31, (9), 6
A cover is shown bearing a British K.G.VI 2½d. stamp
perfinned SLO (Sun Life), tied by a London postmark dated
Dec. 3, 1946, and addressed to Sun Life Assurance Society.
The occurrence of a handstamp - Banket Junction, S.
Rhodesia dated Nov. 4, 1946 seems to indicate that this
envelope entered the Southern Rhodesia postal system and was
somehow transferred to the London post without any Southern
Rhodesia stamps or postage due markings.

Some 500 different perfins are known on the stamps of
India but only about 25% are identified. Simplified lists
(i.e. generally omitting minor pattern varieties) are given
of both identified and unidentified perfins known on postage
stamps, revenue stamps and postal stationery. In addition,
full details are included of the perfins found on the postage
stamps and revenue stamps of the various Indian States.

Large quantities of Papuan stamps perfinned OS were cancelled to order (C.T.O.) before being sold to collectors. In a review of some 400 stamps, practically all of the cancellations were Port Moresby with a few Samarai. Details of the spread of dates found are also given.

It is generally accepted that there are 8 perfin patterns from Greece and 3 from Crete, three of the former and one of the latter being unidentified. Identities are suggested for the unknown patterns and it is considered that the Cretan perfin XET does not exist, it having been confused with an overprint. An additional Cretan perfin "28" of Austrian Lloyd is known on the stamps of the British Administration. Many stamps perfinned TE (Bank of Greece) are considered to be fakes as they were issued before the Bank began operating (1928) and before perfins were officially permitted (1930).

0373 City of London arms

SEPS Bull., Jan./Feb. 1979, (179), 2

A "new" die recorded in S.E.P.S. Bulletin No. 178 by Peter Day had been previously noted by John Nelson in the October 1966 Bulletin and the "new" die is known on a K.E. VII 1d postmarked 15th Oct. 1902 from the Guildhall School of Music. The dies illustrated in Bulletin No. 178 were in fact mirror images of the coat of arms. (Complete)

0374 New official?

Dunderdale S.

S.E.P.S. Bull., Jan./Feb. 1979 (179), 2

The perfin NA/CB (13, 10/8, 14), 5mm is known on a cover franked with a K.G.V 1d cancelled in Liverpool on November 22nd., 1917. The reverse of the cover bears a rubber stamp reading "Navy & Army Canteen Board, Royal Liver Building, Liverpool." (Complete)
