#### MOUNTING\_PERFINS

### By Michael Rucklidge.

The problem of mounting and displaying perfins seems to have no clear-cut solution. The "best" answer depends on what one collects. This can vary enormously according to the individual's taste and amount of time devoted and (see recent auction realisations!) the amount of money available. For instance one can collect:

- (1) all perfins on as many different stamps for each as one can get.
- (2) a single copy of all perfins.
- (3) identified perfins.
- (4) perfins with a specific theme such as those used in one's home town, full names, patterns, those related to a particular industry or profession.

And no doubt many other collecting guide-lines are possible.

As there are upwards of 20,000 British perfins and some 3,000 identified perfins, (1) and (2) above present formidable problems both in space and expense. Options (3) and (4) are somewhat easier but there is still one big snag. Strict alphabetical order is highly desirable, since otherwise the task of deciding whether one has, or has not, a particular perfin is laborious. The difficulty arises when we consider that, despite the immense efforts of our catalogue editors, new perfins are always coming to light. Consequently we need a "one perfin to one page" system in a loose leaf fashion. Unless a very limited field is chosen this can entail considerable expense. Also a single stamp per page (if only a single copy is collected) looks rather isolated.

Recently I tried the 5 x 3 inch filing cards available at stationers. These can easily hold.

- (1) two perfins (on stamps of normal size) or one perfin and a tracing or photograph of the perfin.
- (2) perfin letters.
- (3) numbers of holes in letters.
- (4) height of letters.
- (5) catalogue number.
- (6) user (if known)

These cards can be kept in the metal filing trays sold for the purpose (or, if you are short of money, in a shoe-box.)

I did not find this system entirely satisfactory since a card has to be extracted entirely for checking. So I am now experimenting in mounting these three to an A4 sheet. Album pages would no doubt look better, but would be rather expensive. Most stationers sell these sheets in "heavy typing" paper at about lp per sheet. The cards are mounted in "post-card album style" i.e. 4 diagonal cuts across the corners of each card position are made by a sharp knife using a template.

I intend mounting these perhaps 50 or so at a time between stout card outers using the "plastic prong spine". By inserting blank sheets every so often it will be possible to maintain the cards in strict order with a relatively small amount of rearrangement.

At the moment I am confining myself toidentified perfins. Even so I shall require some twenty "albums".

Incidentally, my "raw" perfin collection is mounted on sheets (ten to a sheet) in seven spring-back holders.

Well there is my current solution to the problem. It would, I am sure, be of interest to members, especially newer ones, if others would write a short description of how they do it. Why not drop a note to the Editor?

# LIBRARY DONATION - A report from Brian Birch.

Joe and Dorothy Balough of the Perfins Club have donated to the Library a copy of the new illustrated "Catalogue of United States Perfins - 1979" published by the Perfins Club.

Those of you who have seen a copy of the 1966 version will have had a foretaste of this present volume. Although based on the same lines it is bigger (about 25% more pages) and much better. The Catalogue covers some 6,000 perfins in 550 plus pages, most of which constitute the basic alphabetical list except for the last 46 pages which includes sections on illegal perfins, philatelic perfins, schermachs and other supplemental information.

I find it impossible to fault this book and I urge all of you who have any interest in U.S. perfins to order a copy from  ${\tt J.}$  Gooding

#### NEW PERFIN STUDY GROUP

Member Jon Johnson has sent us the following press handout, The BNAPS Canadian Perfin Study Group has been revived to review and research Canadian perfins. The primary object of the Study Group will be to update the information in the 3rd Edition of the BNAPS Handbook on Canadian Perfins with the intention of eventually writing a 4th Edition. Additional objectives of the Study Group are to add information to that presently in the Canadian Handbook, to provide perfin collectors with a source where answers to Canadian Perfin queries or problems may be found, to promote perfins by assisting collectors in writing articles and perfin postal histories for philatelic journals and newspapers.

The Study Group will have a monthly newsletter to provide collectors with new information and to issue research questionnaires. Anyone who is interested in Canadian Perfins and the Study Group should contact J.C. Johnson

Also, for those looking for a Canadian Perfin reference, the 3rd Edition of the BNAPS Handbook has been reprinted and is available for \$4.50 Canadian, at the same address.

### PERFIN ABSTRACTS - INDEX

Early in 1975 the S.E.P.S. began to publish Perfins Abstracts, distributing a few pages with each issue of the Bulletin. By Early 1980 abstract number 0500 will have been distributed and Perfins Abstracts will have grown to almost 100 pages in length. Although a set of indexes covering abstracts 0001 to 0150 was published in March 1977, these are now well out of date and a new set has been prepared to cover all abstracts up to 0500. As before, the Index consists of three parts: (1) a list of the abbreviations of periodical titles used; (2) an author index and, (3) a subject index.

- (1) Abbreviations of Periodical Titles. Since the majority of items listed in Perfins Abstracts were originally published in periodicals, the titles of the periodicals have been abbreviated, in accordance with British and U.S. standards, in order to save space. The abbreviations used are listed in alphabetical order, followed by the full title of the periodical.
  - (2) Author Index. All authors are listed in alphabetical order, followed by the title of the item and its abstract number.
- (3) Subject Index. An effort has been made to produce as comprehensive and useful a subject index as possible. Entries are given both against the country of origin and subject (theme), whilst many perfins will be found listed individually.

The new index contains 55 pages and would take almost two years to distibute with the Bulletin. Therefore, it has been decided to publish it separately at £1.40 post free. Orders should be sent to Ron Bowman

Those newer members who do not have the earlier pages of

Perfin Abstracts can order them from Ron at the same time as they order the Index. (I can supply photocopies of any pages Ron no longer has available).

This Index is recommended not only to those who want to check their facts before publishing them but also to every collector who wishes to know more about perfins.

0456 Japanese perfin TK\* Adachi S.

Perf. Bull., Sept. 1977, 30, (8), 7

A Japanese cover bearing the perfin TK and the return address of Teijiro Kuresawa indicates the origin of the TK perfin which is used in connection with his business - Kurasawa Shoten (i.e. Kurasawa Company). The company are importers and suppliers of business machines and are still in business in Tokyo. (See also 0189).

0457 U.S.1908 perf in covers\* Cummings W.

Perf. Bull., Sept. 1977, 30, (8), 7

The United States Post Office officially permitted the use of perfins in 1908. Following a list of 1908 perfin covers published in the May 1977 Perfins Bulletin (see 0174), a few notes are given on the third earliest and ninth earliest covers - the latter not being included in the May list. It is also pointed. out that a Schermack strip shown in the May Perfins Bulletin (see 0176) would appear to have an unrecorded variety in that only one Schermack slot is punched every other time.

0458 Phillipine commercial postage stamps 1910-1936 Warren A.H.

Am. Philat., July 1950, 63, (10), 765-774

Between 1912 and 1935, certain large users of Phillipine postage stamps were permitted the exclusive use of postage stamps which could be identified in case of theft or unauthorised use. These stamps may be classified as follows:-

- A. Perfins
- B. Imperforate stamps, issued in 1925 for the exclusive use of one firm.
- C. Handstamped with users name or initials.
- D. Overprinted for the user by the Bureau of Posts. Altogether 12 different items in the above four classes are shown and discussed in detail. A checklist of all known stamps bearing each security endorsement is included.
- 0459 Canada's provisional stamps Patrick D. & Patrick M.

The Congress Book; Thirty third American Philatelic Congress 1967, American Philatelic Congress Inc., Devon, Pa., 1967, pp.127-135

In 1949 a shortage of Canadian officials overprinted OHMS occurred. As a provisional measure, the 2c and 3c revised design definitives of 1949 were perforated "OH/MS" for official use.

0460 YALE perfin

SEPS Bull., May/June 1979, (181), 3

The British full name perfin YALE is relatively scarse and has not yet been identified with certainty although it is thought to belonp, to the Yale and Towne Manufacturing Co. of Willenhall.

0461 The Yost Typewriter Company SEPS Bull., May/June 1979, (181), 3-4

The Yost Typewriter Company is known to have used various dies of the perfin YOST. Although it was registered in 1891, perfins are known from 1889. The company went into voluntary liquidation in December 1923.

0462 "N.W. Pacific Islands" Colbran W.G.

Stamp Collect., July 24th. 1975,  $\underline{124}$ , (21), 935, 937, 939 & 941

Australian stamps overprinted "N.W. Pacific Islands" were used in New Guinea and Nauru. Although they had a relatively short life in Nauru they remained in use in New Guinea until 1925. These stamps are known perfinned OS for official use and a full list of all 23 stamps that are known thus is included.

0463 Sacramento Northern Railway - historical development Jacque A.G. & Lougee K.F.

Private communication (K.F. Lougee to W.C. Ayers) July 1961, pp.4

The development of the Sacramento Northern Railway through its acquisition of many minor railway companies is outlined. One of the companies acquired by the Sacramento Northern Railway was the Northern Electric Railway Company, which used the perfin NER.

0464 U.S. perforated initials

Lawrence E.P.

Mekeel's Wkly., Jan. 10th. 1947

Forty eight different (predominantly U.S.) perfins are illustrated and collecting perfins is suggested as a sideline.

0465 Perforated initials on U.S. Stamps Lawrence E.P.

Mekeel's Wkly., Jan. 20th., 1947

A page of forty eight different U.S, perfins is shown as an example of a sideline collection.

0466 Perforated "S" in stamp

Konwiser Ti.M., Ellis F. & Stuntzner R.L.

Stamps, Dec. 16th 1944 & July 28th. 1945

A 2c Presidential issue stamp is known punched with an S (not perforated) and. used in New York. This initial is also known punched in a 1903 2c shield stamp and a fully dimensioned drawing of the S is shown.

0467 Railroading with Stuart perfins

Corliss W.R.

Bur. Spec., July 1952, <u>23</u>, (7), 128-131

An alphabetical list of perfins used by U.S. railroads and associated companies is given, those patterns known on the 1932 3c Stuart portrait of Washington being indicated by an asterisk.

0468 MSC/MSU perfin

Allen W.

Private Correspondence; W. Allen to K.F. Lougee, Oct. 10th 1975, pp.2

U.S. stamps can be found bearing the perfins PaTSC and MSU which are identical except that the C has been modified to form the U. Proofs of this multiple head machine are given showing the original T-iwC, the modified version to give MSU and the effect of replacing all of the pins i.e. effectively showing MSO.

0469 Stamping around

Stewart H. C. & Haraden G.

Schenectady Star, June 4th, 1935

An early general introduction to perfin collecting, starting with an explanation of a system of classification (now obsolete) and explaining the methods used to identify different branch offices of the same company.

0470 Stamp-o-rama - The pin hole markings

Morison M.

Rochester Times Union, 21st. Apr. 1956
A general introduction to perfins collecting.

0471 A perfin oddity

Unpublished - Perfins Club Library, pp.3.

The American Appraisal Company, besides having a perfin AA/Co also had a machine which perforated its full name AMERICAN APPRAISAL. Examples of both of these dies are shown including a reconstruction of the latter perfin over 6 stamps.

0472 Stamps perforated "OHMS"

A cover is illustrated showing two stomps bearing FEC/Ry perfins 3nd cancelled with a "Jack\_& Key West R.P.O." dated 1941, 6 years after the railroad ceased to operate.
