RAILWAY PERFINS - NEW IDENTIFICATIONS

Mike Oxley has offered two 'new' Railway Company identifications which, although not supported by covers, are 99% certain to be correct.

- a) THE POTTERIES, SHREWSBURY AND NORTH WALES RAILWAY  
P/SNWR 9/10,13,16,11 on QV ld plate 145 postmarked 708 (Shrewsbury)  
This Company was formed by the amalgamation of the Shrewsbury and North Wales Railway on 16th July 1866 with the Shrewsbury and Potteries Junction Railway,
- b) THE GREAT NORTHERN RAILWAY (IRELAND)  
I/GNR 5/10,13,13 on QV ld plate 171 postmarked 186 (Dublin)  
This Company was formed by the amalgamation of several small companies in 1876

## RAILWAY PERFINS CONTINUED

Ron Bowman has a confirming cover for the following company, MID WALES RAILWAY which opened a line from Llanidloes to Newbridge on 1st September 1864.

The cover bears a QV 1d lilac with the perfin MWR 15,15,12 5½mm postmarked BRECON October 5th 1883 and addressed to G.H. Page Esq. Hay R.S.O. The flap of the envelope is embossed with the company name and the cover backstamped twice, once with SHREWSBURY L I October 5th 1883 and the second time with HAY October 6th 1883. A similar die is shown in the 'Tilles' catalogue with Cat. No. 613.2 but this has stops between letters and a slightly narrower overall width.

A second possible is M.W.R 15,16,11 4mm also shown in 'Tilles' with Catalogue Number 613.1.

Ron Bowman would be pleased to hear from anyone with further details of stamps on which any of the dies mentioned above for the three companies.

Bourguignon, A . & Dedecker, R.  
Bull. Liaison, Apr. 1978, (5), 3  
Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 17, pp.3  
The French perfin J.B. is very large and can only be found complete on large stamps. However, it is possible for individual letters or even the "revised" perfin to appear on normal size definitives giving rise to an apparently unlisted perfin. Examples are illustrated to show how the confusion could occur.
- 0667 Perforation Claude Lafontaine

Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 17, pp.2  
The underprint CLHPM & Cie a CHARLEVILLE, found on French stamps was followed by the perfin C.A. (h: 6¾, 11-13) which itself was followed by the perfin C.A. (h: 6½, 8-10). The first and last dates of use of each of these security endorsements is given.
- 0668 Remarks on the large perforations

Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 17, pp.3  
Occasionally, one finds French stamps punched with a single hole 5mm in diameter. This was an official perforation connected with the Post Office postal packet service. It is also possible to find stamps bearing private perfins thus punched.

Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 17, pp.2  
A block of 4 stamps bearing the perfin L.H is described. As the block has two publicity labels attached to it, it must have originated from a booklet.

Practical philately, Hutchinson & Co. Ltd., London, 1953, 196-199  
A general introduction to perfins and suggestions for a thematic collection concerning railways.
- 0671 Minnesota perfins  
Wilson, J.M.  
Jon M. Wilson, Bound Brook, U.S.A., c.'1974, pp.4  
An unpublished alphabetical list of perfins used by Companies and organisations in Minnesota.
- 0672 From the secretary - Danish GK perfin\*  
Engelbrecht, P.  
Perf. Bull., June 1979, 32, (6), 1  
A single die perforator, GK, was ordered by the Municipality of Gentofte (Gentofte Kommune). As it was very slow, they returned it and ordered a 10-die machine. The GK perforator has now been acquired by Peter Engelbrecht who calls himself the "old collector" which in Danish is Gamle Kollektor.

A brief review of the Perfins Club's policy towards the publication of catalogues of foreign perfins.
- 0674 Perfin potpourri

A perfin S.B. is shown on a non-rectangular stamp. The stamp is a triangular, Scott 204 from the Netherlands. The perfin HS., found on Australian stamps, is shown to have been derived from the HS/&Co perfin of Howard Smith & Co. but it is not known why the missing letters were removed. In the past, the State of Victoria in Australia used the perfin VG produced by 12-die machines. The die has changed in recent years and perf ins are shown which indicate that the machine might be a single die machine. Code holes are not common on British stamps but two dies of the perfin BB (monogram) are shown, one of which has an additional hole in the bottom loop of the B and it is suggested that this could be a branch code hole. Two different BEG perfins from Spain are shown indicating that the Banco Espanol de Credito used two perforating machines. However, all known examples bear Madrid postmarks.

The private stamps issued by J. Spinhayer & Cie. are known bearing both the MS (monogram) perfin of Menageries Spinhayer and the WAUQUEZ perfin more familiarly found on Belgian stamps.

Perf. Bull., June 1979, 32, (6),  
Three perfins found on the U.S. 1932 Summer and Winter Olympics issues are shown with a request for the identities of the users.
- 0677 Scandinavian perfins on cinderella stamps\*  
Bergman, L.  
Leif Bergman, Sweden, n.d., pp.2  
An unpublished manuscript containing lists of perfins from Denmark and Sweden found on the cinderella stamps and postal stationery of these countries. The cinderellas include; locals; revenues; Christmas seals and railway freight stamps.
- 0678 G.B. identities catalogue\*  
S.E.P.S., 1957-1960, pp.47  
The first edition of the catalogue of identified British perfins.
- 0679 Railway perfins  
Powell, R.W.  
S.E.P.S. Bull., Mar./Apr. 1980, (186), 2  
The perfin B has now been identified as belonging to the Bengal & North Western Railway Ltd. The perfin U.D, which is

ascribed to the Metropolitan Railway Company in S.E.P.S. catalogues is known to have also been used by the Underground Electric Railway Company of London Ltd. although the relationship between the two is not known.

0680 Who knows the answer?

The perfin R.P.R/Co. is known on an 1873, 3d rose, plate 10 cancelled with crown handstamps. These crown cancellations are said to be inspector's marks and a request is made for further information.

0681 Swiss "T" perfin

S.E.P.S. Bull., Mar./Apr. 1980, (186), 3

The perfin T, found on Swiss postage and telegraph stamps, was used by the firm of Thamaun & Leich, Zurich and was the only officially sanctioned private perfin.

0682 Streets of London

Burrows, M. J.

S.E.P.S. Bull., Mar./Apr. 1980, (186), 4-6

Although it is not known which company first included some indication of its location in its perfin, the earliest 1d red plate number known bearing such a perfin is plate 86 - C & B/SOHO. A full list of all known address perfins is included.

0683 Perforated stamps from State concerns and private companies\*

Norgeskatalogen 1978, Oslo Filatelistklubb, Oslo, 1977, 205-210

Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 47, pp.6

An illustrated list of all state concerns which used perfins is given. Most of them ceased to use perfins when "Official stamps" became available in 1933. A similar list of all private perfins is also included.

A complete listing of private and official perfins differing very little from the 1978 edition (see: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 47 for a translation of the text).

An S perfin of Swift Company has been found on a Newfoundland stamp. It was previously known only on U.S. stamps.

The Canadian General Electric perfin C/GE (catalogue No. 10a) was remade or repaired to produce larger holes and became 10b. The changeover occurred between 3rd Nov. 1952 (last use of 10a) and 1st Apr. 1953 (1st use of 10b).
- 0688 Glossary of perfin terminology  
BNA Perf., Feb. 1980, 1, (2), 3  
A glossary of terms relating to perfins.
- 0689 Postage stamps: miscellaneous regulations  
Post Office guide, The Post Office, London, 1969,  
28-29 & 560  
These are the regulations which govern the use of perfins in Great Britain. A full review is given in abstract number 0645. The 1969 regulations also indicated that perforated stamps could not be added to postal orders to increase the face value.
- 0690 The Official perfins of Guatemala  
Schwerdt, R.J.  
Perf. Bull., Mar. 1980, 33, (3), 1  
Although the Scott catalogue indicates that the Guatemala official perfin "OFICIAL" was of two types, there is no indication of the difference between them. Three types of this perfin are illustrated, differing in the number of pins in the C, and the question is posed as to whether this is one perfin showing progressively more broken pins or three different perfins, the number of holes in the C serving as a control.
- 0691 Two new Turkish patterns reported  
Maxa, V.  
Perf. Bull., Mar. 1980, 33, (3),  
Two perfin patterns have been found on Turkish stamps which are not listed in Dr. Harvey Tilles "Catalog of the perfins of the Middle East". The pattern BACL is not identified, but the O.C.M. pattern was used by the Oriental Carpet Manufacturing Company. (Complete)
- 0692 A working catalog of the perfins of Mauritius  
Schwerdt, R.J.  
Perf. Bull., Mar. 1980, 33, (3), 3  
All 12 perfins known on the stamps of Mauritius are illustrated. Seven of the users have been positively identified and 2 tentatively identified.
- 0693 A note from Alan R. Miskimin raises some questions  
Miskimin, A.R.  
Perf. Bull., Mar. 1980, 33, (3), 4  
Three perfins listed in the new illustrated U.S. catalogue are queried. FNB is known to be the Frost National Bank not the First National Bank. AIW, which was ascribed to the Alamo Iron works is now in question since long-service employees of this company who worked in the mail room cannot recall the company using perfins. Finally, Fox, which was listed as belonging to the Fox Machinery Company is in error as there apparently was never such a Company. However, the Fox Photo Company does exist and did at one time use perfins.

British Patent No. 1985, Sept. 1858, pp.6  
In 1858, Joseph Sloper applied for and received a British Patent on his improved apparatus for indelibly marking fiscal documents to prevent fraudulent use. The operation of the perforating machine is described in detail with 7 drawings showing both the machine and typical perforation patterns.
- 0660 Full name perfins - F\*  
S.E.P.S. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1979, (184), 6  
Letter F of the full name perfins listing of Great Britain includes FISON, which is unidentified, and FLOUR, which was the telegraphic address of Buchanan's Flour Mills Ltd. A list of all stamps known bearing these perfins is included.
- 0661 Oxford Union Society  
Cummings, Rev. H.  
The college stamps of Oxford and Cambridge, Simpkin Marshall & Co. Ltd., London, 1904, 91-95  
From 1857 or 1858 to about 1885, the Oxford Union Society made use of stamps overprinted or underprinted with the letters O.U.S. between two wavy lines. Details are included of the six different overprints and a list is included of all stamps known bearing the overprint.
- 0662 Foreign Branch  
Westley, H. C .  
Postal cancellations of London; 1840-1890, H.F. Johnson, London, 1950, 43-45  
Although not directly related to security endorsements, full details are given of the various Foreign Branch cancellations used to precancel items going abroad from: Smith Elder & Co. William Dawson & Sons and W.H. Smith & Sons. These handstamps are often found on perfins.
- 0663 Answers: No. 3 perforated postal stationery  
Benjamin, R.K. & Herbert, M.  
Bull. Liaison, Apr. 1978, (5), 2  
Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 17, pp.2  
Seven more perfins are reported on French postal stationery.
- 0664 Answers: No. 5 Most recent date known  
Peylan, E., Fontaine, M., Ribault, N.D.L. & Roche, E.  
Bull. Liaison, Apr. 1978, (5), 2  
Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 17, pp.2  
Three French perfins are listed which have been used after the withdrawal of authorization for their use on the 21st January, 1955.
- 0665 Answers: No. 6 Precancelled stamps; perforated  
Roche, E. &, Benjamin, R.K.  
Bull. Liaison, Apr. 1978, (5), 2  
Translation: S.E.P.S. TRANS. 17, pp.2  
Three French perfins are listed together with details of the precancelled stamps on which they have been found.

PERFINS AUCTION No. 3 (1981)

With some steady bidding still taking place on Auction No. 2 at the time of writing, the increasing demand for all perfin material is well in evidence. Particular interest is always shown in covers and literature, and once again a fine selection of both of these is on offer here. Also of note is a large selection of Australian material.
