#### PUZZLING LINES

#### By Mary Thornton

Cat. No. 558 AUX 10,10,9 5½mm used by the Army & Navy Auxiliary Co-operative Supply Limited is a very

well known perfin, and also an interesting one because of the unusual arrangement of having lines above and below the letters "AUX".

Four dies are recorded. These have the same lettering but there are differences in the number of pins used to form the lines - 13, 11, 9 and 7. What could have been the reason for these variations? They were not caused by missing pins but by design, and therefore it would seem that the Co-operative needed several perforating machines, almost identical but with minor differences.

Mr J. Nelson kindly supplied the following information from his 1895 edition of Kelly's London Directory-.

ARMY & NAVY AUXILIARY CO-OPERATIVE SUPPLY LIMITED (Commander L.A.Saumarez & Captain A.C. Campbell ) (Managing Directors; Charles Richards, Secretary ) Francis Street, Victoria Street, S.W.

(TA "Auxiliary", TN 3069)

Logan Place, Earl's Court, W.

Caxton Street, Westminster, S.W. (Depot for the sale of new carriages.)

Could a different die have been used at each of the above addresses? Not having any covers with identity I cannot tell, but I will risk making four guesses.

Die 1. 13 pins These are seen on Q.V, stamps, 1d lilacs and 16½mm. Jubilees. The earliest date I have is 1895 on ½d vermilion. They are also found on the stamps of K.E.Vll.

The perfins seen are sideways, and in four different positions, showing that sheets or blocks were folded before perforation.

It is curious that 13 pins were used, as this is not thought to be a lucky number. There is the coincidence that "Francis Street" also has 13 letters, Was Die 1 used at that address?

Die 2 9 pins This die was also used on the ld lilac and 16½mm. Jubilee issues. It is horizontal on my stamps but sideways on the K.E.Vll issues, and in four positions.

"Carriages" has 9 letters, could this perfin have been used at Caxton Street perhaps?

Die 3 7 pins This was used on K.E.VII issues, sideways and 12½mm. in four positions.

Could this refer to Logan PL. (Logan Place)?

Die 4 11 pins This differs from the other dies in two ways.

13½mm. It was used in the horizontal position, and from the examples I have seen is the only one of the four to be found on the stamps of K.G.V.

This suggests that it might, eventually, have replaced the other dies. Why 11 pins? Perhaps a reference to "Army and Navy"? In 1919 the business was acquired by the Army & Navy Co-operative Society Ltd. (whose name changed to Army & Navy Stores Ltd. in 1934)

#### TELEGRAPHIC ADDRESSES

A few concerns are known to have preferred their stamps perforated with their telegraphic address (T.A) rather than initials. Several full name perfins come into this category. The following shows telegraphic address perfins that differ from the company title.

The only details available give this firm as warehousemen.

Incorporated as a limited company in 1899. It was formed to acquire, amalgamate, and run firms engaged in the Oil and Cake Manufacture and Oil Refining industries. By 1923 it had expanded to control some 30 mills and 15 oil refineries at various locations: London, Avonmouth, Bristol, Burntisland, Gainsborough, Glasgow, Gloucester, Hull, Ipswich, Leith, Liverpool, Manchester, and Rochester.

Etna Iron Works Grahamstown, Falkirk.

Ironfounders, registered in August 1896. T.A later changed to IRON. The Etna Iron & Steel Co., Ltd., of Motherwell use ETNA for their T.A, also as a brand name.

Richard Haworth started this cotton spinning, manufacturing and merchants business in 1852. It was incorporated as a limited company in 1897. Makers of the well-known SPERO branded goods, their their mills were, in their day considered to be one of the sights of Manchester.

0734 Perfins of Peru\* Bladorn, H.W.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 4

There does not seem to be any published data on the perfins of Peru. Only three perfins are recorded - EH used between 1929 & 1931 in Areguipa; B.F.C. used in Lima (on Scott 245) and BM/AP (on Scott 214). (Complete)

0735 FNB perfins on shippiing label\* Pfaber, I.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 4

A shipping label is shown bearing 5 x 50c and 2 x 20c definitives. All of the stamps are perfinned FNB of the First National Bank. The note appears to have accompanied a shipment of over \$376,000 to the Federal Reserve Bank.

Background on Japanese perfins

Perf. Dull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 5-6

A brief history of Japanese security endorsements is given, derived from the third edition of Adachi's catalogue. It covers the whole era, starting with the early embossed endorsement and rubber stamp endorsements and ending with the gradual phasing out of perfins in the mid 1960's.

0737 Building your personal perfins collection Walker, F. A.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 7-10 As an aid to obtaining copies of philatelic society and personal perfins, an illustrated list of all those known and is given, together with details of how and from whom copies are available.

0738 Delaware Lackawanna & Western Railroad advertising character\* Hoyt, E.S.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec, 1980, 33, (10), 10

The Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad (perfin D-78: DL&W) used an advertising character named Phoebe Snow who would stand on the observation platform in an all-white dress to make the point that the DL&W used clean - burning anthracite rather than the bituminous coal used by most other railways.

0739 International Harvester Company advertising character\* Stroupe Jr., V.S.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 10

In the early 1900's, the International Harvester Company used an advertising character named Prospy (short for prosperity). This character is shown and appears to be an indian with corn-cob body holding the IHC logo (the same as the perfin) as a shield.

0740 Perfinned Scott 505 (Washington 5c rose error)\* Balough, J. J.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 10

A second copy of Scott 505 (Washington 5c rose error) is known with the N.173 perfin of the Bell Telephone Company of Omaha. The precious perfinned Scott 505 is on cover. Both are owned by the author. (Complete)

0741 Seven ways to collect perfins

Crow, R.B.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 11-12

Greater interest can be given to a perfins collection if one collects with a theme in mind. The most common method of collecting perfins is one of each pattern but there are many other possibilities:- issue collecting; topical; precancels; perfin varieties; perfins on cover and postal markings on perfins to name but a few.

0742 Canadian revenue perfins

Dicketts, M.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 13

A general introduction to perfinned Canadian revenue stamps. Apart from the per•f ins of Canadian companies, certain Canadian revenues are also known bearing U.S. and British perfins.

0743 What are your perfins worth?

A brief introduction to the value of perfins including an explanation of the U.S. Cain ratings.

0744 Perfins on Scott 332 and 375, continued Owen, L.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 15-17

Scott 332 and 375 are the 1908-1910 2c Washington with the value in words (SG 339 and 382). The checklist of all known perfins on these stamps is concluded with the letters M to Z plus the numerals and designs.

0745 Cover talk

Harrell, F.

Perf. Bull., Nov./Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 19

Two covers ,,ith commemorative cachets and return addresses are illustrated. Both bear Perfins which appear to have no connection with either the event or the user (one is GE, the other FAC (F19) ). It is suggested that they could be examples of unauthorized use of the perfins.

A collector tip

Perf. Bull., Nov,/Dec. 1980, 33, (10), 20

Whilst waiting for a suitable time to mount their perfins, many collectors keep them in stock books. It is suggested that inserting a loose leaf stock sheet between each letter of the alphabet in the (U.S.) catalogue is a more convenient way of storing new acquisitions than using a separate stock book,

0747 Damaged stamps

Hornung, O.

Illustrated Encyclopaedia of stamp collecting, Hamlyn Publishing Group, London, 1970, 124-128

Section I of the chapter on damaged stamps is entitled 'punched stamps" and includes perfins. Although they are included in the section on damaged stamps, it is acknowledged that some can be quite valuable such as the French "E.I.P.A. 30" perfin.

0748 Souvenir sheets of the world - Vol. 2

Zinsmeister, M.C.

Handbook 7, Society of Philatelic Americans, New Jersey, 1956, 8-9

0748 continued

In 1941, Belgium issued a miniature sheet both perforated and imperf. to raise funds for Queen Elizabeth's Musical Foundation. 82,000 each of the perf. and imperf. sheets were issued bearine the monogram of Queen Elizabeth perforated through the stamps.

0749 One thing leads to another Burrows, M.J.

S.E.P.S. Bulls, Nov./Dec. 1980, (190), 5-6

Having heard that it was once possible to purchase perfins at an Ipswich post office, the author, by tracing both the post offices and perfins of Ipswich comes to the conclusion that a sub-postmaster William Day was also an agent for Frank Braham who produced perfins for other companies.

0750 New perfins appearing since 1973 continued BNA Parf., May 1980, 1, (5), 1

This is the final instalment of the newly discovered perfins (since the BNAPS catalogue of 1973) and covers an AC (punched through an Ontario revenue), SUN/LIFE and a design made up of multiple crosses from Canada and two SPECIMEN perforations from Newfoundland.

0751 How perfin machines are made Stump, D.C.

A detailed. account is given of the method used to manufacture perforating machines for perfins, in U. S. A.

0752 Another new find'?

A Canadian stamp is illustrated, bearing a previously unknown perfin. Unfortunately, the perfin runs off the stamp and cannot be determined exactly, but it appears to be E D.

BNA Perf., May 1980,  $\underline{1}$ ,(5), 3 A glossary of perfin terminology is needed as there is a tendency for perfin collectors to give different meanings to accepted words or invent their own words. Six additions to the first list (see: 0688) are given.

A Canadian 15c young, Queen Victoria definitive (large size) perfinned S.L./A Co. is shown. It is only the second "large" Queen perfin reported.

A new U.S. perfin -  $\overline{CH}/Co$  of Crouse Hinds Co., has been found on a Canadian Express stamp. It is shown together with the same perfin on a U.S. stamp.

- BARROW IN FURNESS Cat. No. 1.32B B 10 13mm.

  Illustrated in Tilles Catalogue it has large holes, approximately twice the diameter of normal Sloper perfins. Miss M.E. Thornton has a copy on cover dated 28th November 1961 from the Barrow Corporation Building Department.

  Does anyone have it with other dates? It seems that it may have been in use for a very short period whilst the normal machine had a die change.
- BETHNAL GREEN Information is still sought on the dies noted in Worksheet 2.
- BRISTOL Cat. No. 117.3 B/C confirmed by Mr Frank Summers.
- CAMBERWELL Cat No. 811A C.V 9,9 6mm This was used by St. Giles Camberwell Vestry (Parish).
