The Registry of Business Names

The Registry of Business Names is now closed but it used a perforator "R.B.N." from about 1941 to date. Using the catalogue code this would be R.B.N. 12,14,14,6. The size of the perfin - 26mm long - shows that it was intended to be used on high value stamps, and this is indeed the case as the stamps used in the registry were 2/6 and 5/- values. I have a number of examples of this perfin all from an apparently unchanged die. They are all found on the high value stamps of the period and are found at a number of different angles. This interested me but now that I have obtained an example on piece all is clear. It would seem that the perforator was used not as a security device but as a canceller. My example on piece clearly shows that the stamp was perforated after it had been stuck to the paper. This seems strange since such a stamp could still be used for postage if removed from the page, even though it could not be cashed at a post office.

What price perfins?

As Secretary of the SEPS I am often posed the question of how much perfins are worth. This is usually because I am offered bulk perfins from a non-member. It is a question that I have great difficulty in answering even if I can examine them: unseen it is quite impossible to make any assessment.

I have analysed the prices realised for bulk perfins in the five latest auctions, I have only considered all-different lots or those with "little" duplication.

The prices for E VII are rather out of line and the spread, except for QV, is rather surprising, There does not seem to be any connection between size of lot and price per hundred.

My tentative conclusion is that one may reasonably expect to pay

QV	£5.00 per 100
E VII	£4.00 per 100
G V	£3.00 per 100
G VI & QE II	£2.00 per 100
All reigns	£2.50 per 100

These are for all different (or with only slight duplication) off paper for collector to collector sales. Naturally a dealer would ask substantially more than these.

If you wish to own what must rank as probably the largest and most comprehensive sorted collection of the perfins of Great Britain in existence, then now is your chance.

The Collection itself is housed in 16 filing drawers (15" x 7") each one crammed to capacity with plain postcards on which are mounted in alphabetical order of die literally uncountable thousands of perfins. Each card represents a different die and bears an illustration of the perfin together with details of hole count, size etc as per catalogue. Identities, where known, are given at the top of the card together with other relevant details. The stamps are mounted face up and consist of virtually every perfined stamp imaginable in quantity from line engraved to QE II. There are high values of QV rubbing shoulders with Wildings- the perfin die being the only criterion for mounting. Quality is high though inevitably there are damaged stamps.

Representing as it does years of dedicated research and work by a leading expert in the field, the collection certainly ranks in importance as one of the finest ever formed and contains much material from early collections such as that of Hugh Vallencey to name but one.

Regrettably viewing is not possible as the collection is currently in storage. The successful bidder will be notified by post and he will be responsible for collection from the South Coast as despatch by post would be impracticable.

A conservative estimate of £1000 has been agreed as a guide figure and tenders much below this will not be accepted. It is hoped that this unique collection can be sold entire and will go to someone who will continue to improve it as a fitting memorial to its first owner. As an addition there is a mass of perfin literature, ephemera, letters, notes etc relevant to the collection, many of which form important and historical items in the past study of perfins.
