AUSTRALIAN PERFINS - THE GOVERNMENT OF VICTORIA by Roy Everett

Having read the article by Jon Johnson in Issue 226, and with a quick excellent booklet produced R. to the by В. V. Toop specifically on this subject, the following be said in follow can up to the previous aforesaid article:

On Victorian Government perfins there are four distinct types of die, up to eight positional placements the stamp; dies have on viewed from the front, upright, inverted, upright inverted, inverted sideways downwards sideways downwards. reversed. reversed. sideways upwards, sideways upwards reversed.

The dies are listed 1 to 4 with the following particulars:

Type 1: VG 9,10 used from 1933 to 1953.

Type 2: VG 9,11 used from 1936 to 1953 in combination with Type 1

Type 3: VG 7,10 used from 1953 to 1972.

Type 4: VG 9,11 used from 1976 to date.

In the highly recommended booklet Mr. Toop than proceeds to write about the machines used to perfin stamps with VG and illustrates the actually carrying machine idle and in usage out such perforating. Subsequently are listed Types 1 to 4 in all the so far discovered positional placements from the eight above lettered A to H, and also are given the stamp catalogue numbers and descriptions of all these issues.

At the back, in an Appendix, Mr. Toop then illustrates the methods of entering the sheets into the perfinning machines, detailing how the positional placements were effected in the process.

For those collectors interested in finding out more about this States perfins, and solving exactly which of the processes produced the Figs. 1 and 2 of Mr. Johnson's article, then you can acquire the booklet directly from:

The cover cost of the booklet is A\$6.00 and Air post on top of that must be considered.

Despatch of Bulletin

Some foreign members have expressed concern at the late delivery of bulletins which arrive after the closing date of the relevant auction. In the interest of economy we have normally sent surface bulletins at the "Printed Papers Reduced Rate" which is much the cheapest method. This often results in long delivery times - six or eight weeks or more even to Europe. It is proposed therefore that surface bulletins will be despatched at the full surface rate in future. MORE ON THE PERFIN OF THE REGISTRY OF BUSINESS NAMES

The account of the 'R.B.N.' perfin in the book on G.B. Official Perfins statements that invite further work. Only single two used throughout, but canceller was small variations known, suggesting that more than one die was used.

I have recently been able to make a start on the different dies, by the receipt of a Lot from my son, John, in Canada.

Five different Dies were found and the resulting page from my album is reproduced.

The top row has two pre-perfin items, a five shilling, SG 416 dated 7 APR 1932 and SG 451 dated 16 OCT 1935. On the earlier, the heading is 'Registrar of Business Names', but on the later comes the Departmental name 'Registry of Business Names' that continued throughout.

The second row has two copies of a die labelled R.B.N. (l). One is on SG 451, dated 56 days after the earliest date reported by Edwards and Lucas, and the other on a 1/3 Churchill, SG 662. The distinctive feature being the non-alignment of the pins in the right leg of the 'R'.

In row three is another 5/-, SG 510, perfinned with R.B.N. (2), in which the three pins in the leg of the 'R' are aligned.

The third die, R.B.N. (3) is in row four, and in this the distinctive feature is the marked curve of the three back pins of the lower part of the 'B'. This is shown used on the 2/6 of the 700th Anniversary of Simon de Montfort's Parliament (SG 664), and on SG 670, the Commonwealth Arts Festival 1/6, issued about six weeks later.


The fourth die is in rows five and six. The 'B' is back to normal, but in the 'R' the middle pin of the left side is below the line through the other two at this level. The stamps that definitely have this die are the Post Office Tower 1/3 (SG 680), the Robert Burns 1/3 (SG 686) and the World Cup 1/3 (SG 695). The 'R' is missing from the other stamp shown, the 2/6 for the 900th Anniversary of Westminster Abbey (SG 688), but it comes within the period, and the portion shown is a good match.


One of the World Cup stamps, which was issued 1 June 1966, is seen to have an 'R' with only five pins, and this agrees with Edwards and Lucas, who wrote of a badly damaged 'R' missing half of its 12 pins which was in use for a considerable period in the late 1960's. I have just this one undated example, but would deduce that the period seems unlikely to be more than a month or two, as I end with two copies of the 1/3 SRN6 Hovercraft (SG 703) issued 19 September 1966, that bear the fifth die. In this last die the pin of the 'R' mentioned with Die 4 is now above the other two pins.

28 April 1970 is the latest date known for the use of this perfin so there may well be other dies about which we would welcome information. Finally, I have been able to report the use of the R.B.N. perfin on eight more Commemorative stamps. Dr. Edwards and Miss Lucas named three, SG 142, which must be a typing error, 690 and 691. What others are known?


I was interested by Dr Powell's article in issue No. 226 regarding perfins from coils and it led me to look further into this much neglected aspect of perfin collecting. My first question was why bother to perfin coils. They are far more difficult to perfin than any other form of stamp arrangement, except in an automatic stamp affixing machine. However if the stamp is to be automatically affixed immediately after perfinning the whole exercise seems pointless.

My next question was how common are they and after searching through many thousands of GB perfins the answer was very uncommon indeed. In the June/August 1985 issue of the Perfins Bulletin Donald Whitehead lists some thirty examples of perfinned stamps known with sideways watermarks, but an extensive search through many thousands of GB perfins produced very few for me. One interesting example, not reported earlier, proves to be W/UD of Wiltshire United Dairies, Trowbridge. I found three different variations of these letters on King George VI and Elizabeth issues, W7730.01 W7730.02 and a third previously unrecorded die to become W7730.03. All these are on sideways watermarked stamps showing extensive use over a long period.

Identifying sideways watermarks amongst thousands of photogravure issues is a difficult task and I soon tired so changed my line of investigation. In our No 226 issue Dr Powell had suggested coil stamps can be identified by seeking clipped perfs. This is far easier and soon my pile of stamps of interest started to grow. Unfortunately very few turned out to have sideways watermarks. What then of the others? Presumably from coil machines using upright watermarked stamps. Interesting for that, but not of great Importance, not that is until I looked closely at the perfins.

The vast majority of stamps with upright watermarks and clipped perfs had unusual letters. It is difficult to explain why they are unusual but a glance at the illustrations below show what I mean. The letters have a continental look and some such as J and T are very distinctive. Also they are usually found with a pair of letters near the top of the stamp and a single letter near the centre (although two and one letter dies appear). I would be interested to hear of the latest and earliest stamps bearing these unusual shaped perfins.

Clearly there is a lot of interesting facts to be discovered about stamps from coils, with and without sideways watermarks and I would be interested to hear from anyone with any ideas or information. In a future issue I will provide a more detailed summary of this neglected area of perfin studies.

This does not, of course, apply in cases where in order to provide a die for the personal use of an individual one or more pins have been removed so as to make it unidentifiable with the original die. Only mint stamps should be so perforated.
