From all these Junctions follow signs for MORLEY.

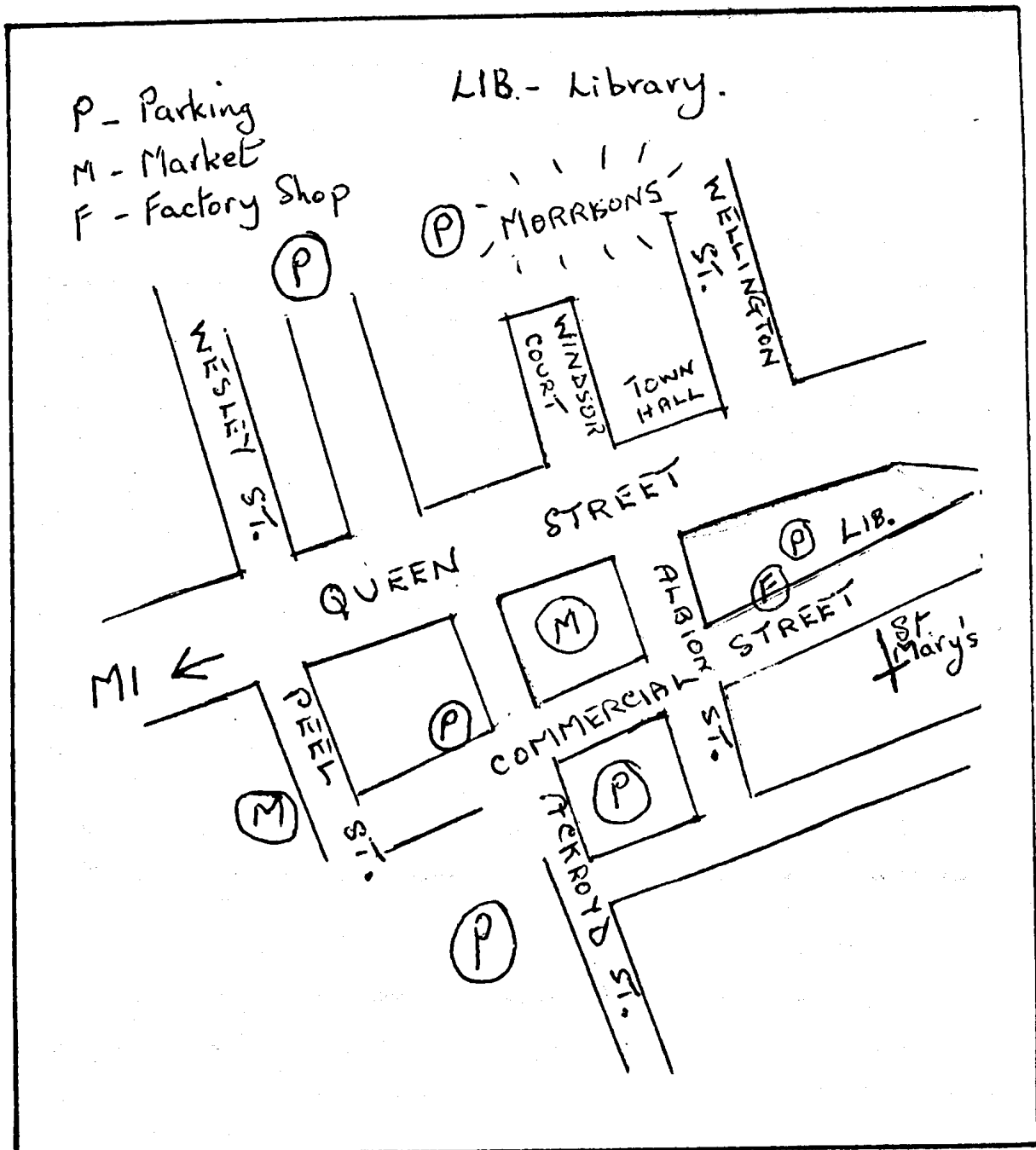
The main road through Morley is QUEEN STREET and COMMERCIAL STREET is parallel to Queen Street. Almost opposite the Town Hall on

All car parks are free.

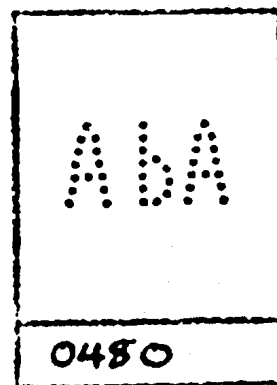
We look forward to seeing many new faces and making new friends. I doubt if I would have found employment with Captain Cook, but the map should ease your car parking manoeuvres.



MEMBERS' QUERIES.

AbA A0480 Perfin.

DAVE HILL thinks this is the only apparently Cyrillic perfin in the G.B. Catalogue. He asks if this really is on a G.B. stamp? If anyone has a copy, can you send details of the value. Dave also asks if it is known to any of our Eastern European members on their stamps and if it is identified? The 'b' certainly looks more 'eastern' than 'western'.



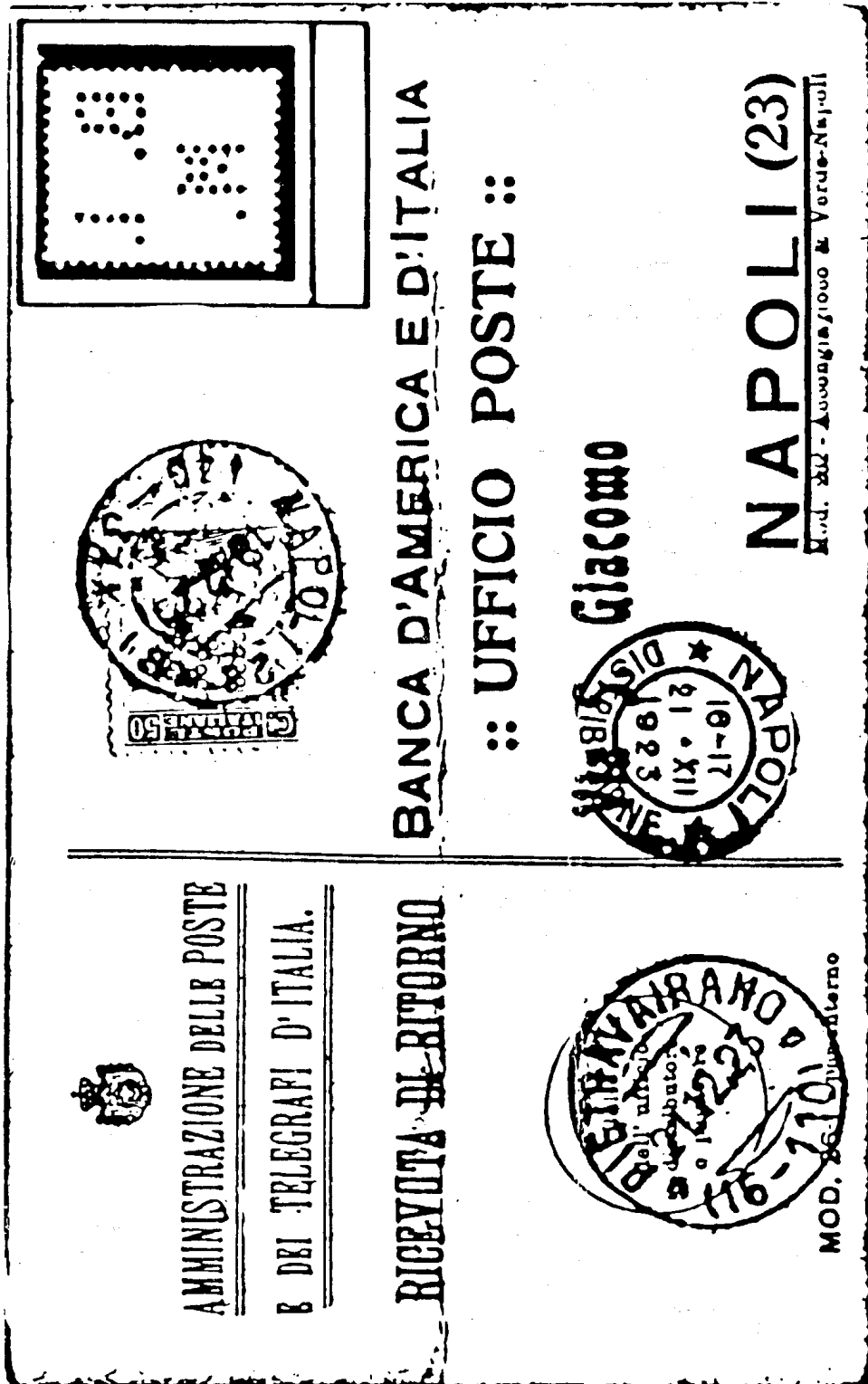
Continuing his enquiries into identifying full names (See Bulletin 246 Pg 11) DAVE asks if anyone has any covers or stamps to help identify J.H/FULLER (J3635.01). From the Guildhall Library, the London P.O. Directories for the late 1800's note 3 possibilities in London E.C. 1) A commission agent of that name which became Fuller & Co. 2) Fullers Earth Union Ltd. 3) Fullers Confectioners who never had initials.

A third query from DAVE concerns perfin C7770 CT/StR . This is a new die in Edwards - not found in Tilles. He has a number of these on pieces of envelope. Dated 1887 from Glasgow on ½d Jubilee stamp the largest piece has CHARLES T... on the reverse and addressed on the front to BANK OIL Co, MIDCALDER. The latter is OAKBANK OIL Co. but who was CHARLES T... of Glasgow and does StR stand for 'Stationers' or a Postal District?

NEW ITALIAN PERFIN, by Douglas Cutler - US Perfins Club Cat. Ed.

Here is a cover, illustrated, postmarked 18 Dec.1923, submitted by Helen Ratzer of an unlisted pattern in the Catalogue, I "PERFIN" D'ITALIA by Giorgio Cerruto. It is listed as pattern B44 in our (Perfins Club) club's Worksheets for Italy, but no ID is given.

B.A./I. is the pattern that Cerruto identifies in his Italian Catalogue as belonging to the Banco D'America E D'Italia. Earliest known date of use is 4 FEB 1927, according to Cerruto, for pattern B.A./I



I confess that I cannot read Italian, so I am not aware if there are any clues contained on the card pertaining to the B.I./M. pattern. Can anyone venture some ideas as to what the B.I./M. pattern stands for?

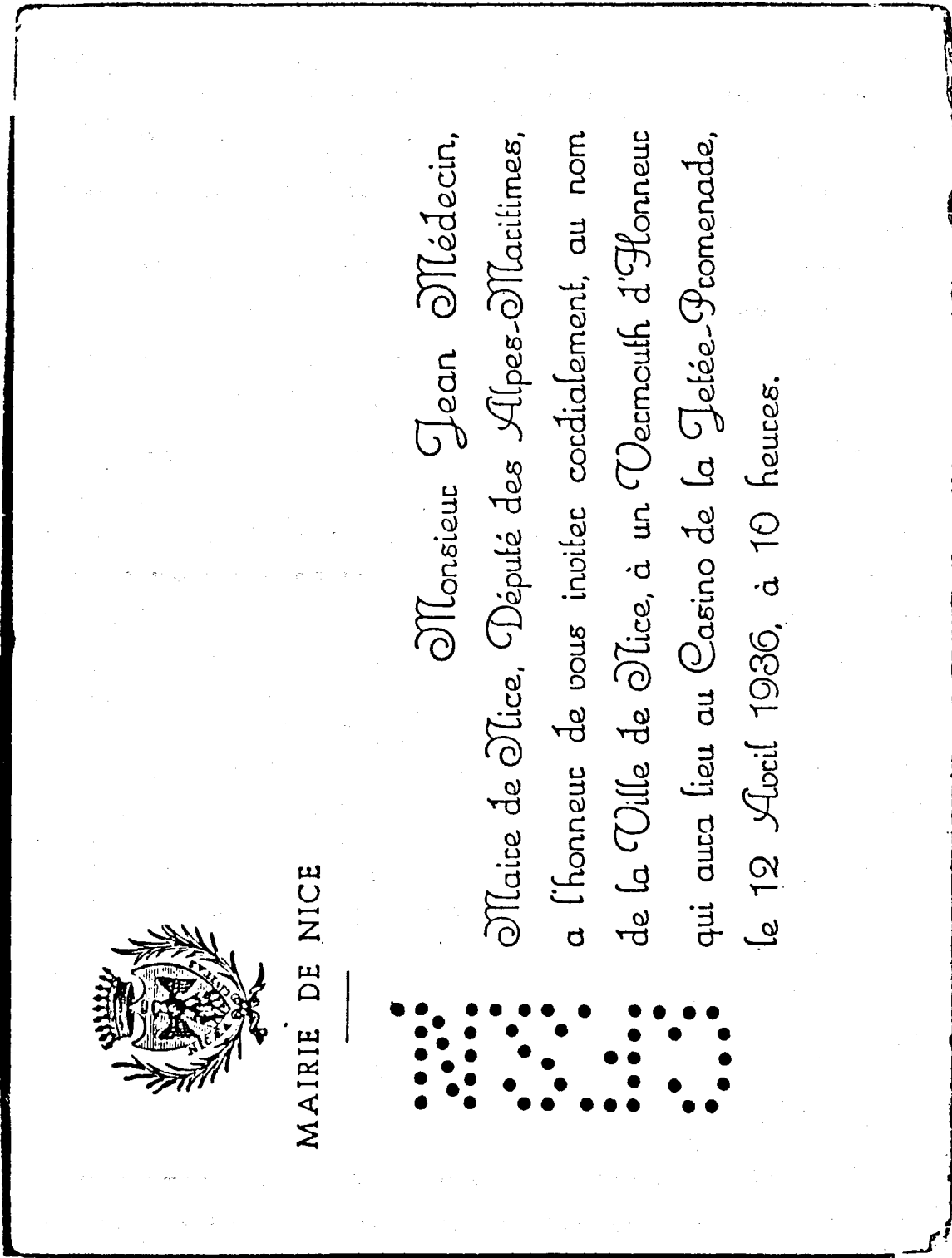

MEMBERS' COMMENTS ON PREVIOUS ARTICLES.

Editorial Query. Bulletin 246 Pg.2.

Non-Philatelic Perfins. Dr. M. Bavin.

From the items on sale in our auctions, and the prices paid, MIKE deduces that many members are interested in non-philatelic perfins. He brings to our attention two publications which may help those collecting cheques and bills of exchange.

"The Bill on London, or The Finance of Trade by Bills of Exchange" published for Gillett Brothers Discount Co. Ltd. by Chapman and Hall (second revised edition 1959). As published, it includes loose artificial documents, complete with spurious fiscal stamps, which illustrates types of bills.

Weightier matters can be referred to "Byles(?) on Bills of Exchange" by F.R. Ryder and others. (London, Sweet (?) and Maxwell, 26th edition, 1988).

Although Mike's letter is the only direct reference to Non-Philatelic items, I have had sent to me a number of articles relating to this subject. I therefore make no apology for including them in this Bulletin. (M.R.S.)

African Association Ltd., Liverpool. Bulletin 246 Pg.11.

Perfin A0230

ROY COOPER has sent a photocopy of an advert from a June 16th 1917 weekly newspaper called "WEST AFRICA". It states:- AFRICAN ASSOCIATION, LTD. , Merchants and Shipowners. Head Office:- Royal Liver Building, Liverpool, and at Manchester, Grand Canary and Teneriffe. Branches at all the Principal Places in NIGERIA, GOLD COAST COLONY, TOGOLAND, SIERRE LEONE, SHERBRO, BELGIUM CONGO. Large and well-assorted Stocks in hand at all Branches".

In the same newspaper is an advert for:- "JOHN HOLT & CO.(LIVERPOOL),LTD., Royal Liver Building, Liverpool, and at 24 Sackville Street, Manchester. Agencies at Havre, Bordeaux, Marseilles, Barcelona and New York. West African Merchants and Shipowners."

The advert goes on to give a long list of exports and imports to and from West Africa and also the principle trade centres in West Africa. The Telegraphic Address is "EBANI Liverpool".

J358 J.H./&C^o. 9,14/12,9,6 6½ (IIIa) is identified with this firm.

H4860.02,.02a & .04 are identified as J. S. Holt & Moseley (London) Ltd. My cover of 4860.04 dated 1937 from London states that the firm had offices in Liverpool and Manchester so it is safe to assume that the John Holt of the advert is the Holt of Holt & Moseley.

No further information about V. B. Company or VIBICO as yet.

Perfin Catalogues. Bulletin 246 pg.14.

Since the issue of the June Bulletin, it has come to my notice that P.GIFFEN, who wrote the "CATALOGUE OF PERFINS OF BRITISH MALAYA" has moved from New Zealand to Australia. However, if anyone requires a copy of this Catalogue, it is available from GLASS SLIPPER, PO BOX 62, YORK YO1 1YL, for £3 post free. For overseas members it can be obtained from 10 Trestrail Avenue, Roleystone 6111, W. Australia. After seeing this 6x5ins, 64 page booklet, I can recommend it for your library.

I have also purchased from GLASS SLIPPER "Perfins of Ceylon" by Albert Ellis. This 53 page booklet, A5 size, has all dies illustrated and detailed on the left hand page with right hand page left blank for you to mount your own perfins. Degree of scarcity has been attempted too. Again, at £4 post paid, a good addition to your book shelf. (Air £5-20p)

The latest Perfin Catalogue offered by Glass Slipper is "Catalogue of Romanian Perfins" by Laszlo Eros. Published by the Perfins Club it has 39 loose leaf A4 pages. Format is similar to the Tilles G.B. Cat. with right hand page showing the dies and left hand page giving user's name, business, town, date of use, and rarity factor. Price is £4-50 (Air £5-85p)

Also in the latest Glass Slipper book list are the following which I have not seen.

AUSTRALIA PERFINS by Toop. Victoria Government Perfins. New Edition. 47 pages A5 size. E5 (Air £6-50)

CANADA PERFINS by Johnson and Tomasson. Detailed. Rarity Guide. 124 pages A5 size. E5 (Air £6-50)

PORTUGAL PERFINS by Roy Everett. Includes colonies & many illustrations. £9 (Air £11-70)

Our Librarian, Geoff Longbottom, informs me that the AUSTRALIAN V.G. PERFINS CAT. by Toop, the CANADIAN PERFINS CAT. and PERFINS OF CEYLON are available on loan from our own library.

WEST AFRICA..

New member ROY COOPER

would like to hear from anyone with any spare "West Africa related items:- perfins, postmarks, covers to 4 from etc. especially Gold Coast.

GENERAL INTEREST. Kemsley Newspapers Limited?

Dr .M. Bavin has on piece 5 x 1/- GVI and 1 x 6d perfin KN/Ltd 10,13/6,5,6 = K1420.01 and 1x2d pale red-brown perfin K 10 = K0010.07. The fragment bears the printing ...TIMES. There is a London pmk. K0010.07 is identified as Kemsley Newspapers. Can we say ...TIMES was a publication by Kemsley Newspapers and therefore K1420.01 is identified as Kemsley Newspapers Ltd? In the past I am sure many identities have been guessed on far more tenuous evidence.

"Baker" Perforating Machine. Main information from Mike Bavin.

I have had this information for some months, awaiting space and an appropriate time to publish in the Bulletin. The item about the visit to Sloper's Works (Bulletin 246) reminded me that once Joseph Sloper's Patent ran out in 1872, other firms got into the action and began to produce stamp perforating machines.

One such firm was FRANK BAKER and from the London P.O. Directory of 1913, MIKE sends the following entry:-

"Frank Baker, die maker, letter cutter, stamper, metal label, name plate and brand iron maker and memorial brass engraver. London agent F. A. Tory, 91 Cannon St., E.C. 28 & 29 St. Paul's Square, Birmingham."

Mike has a Frank Baker book pen dated 1910 but suspects the date was added by the finder in the old factory archives. The two illustrations make up an A4 size publicity leaflet about the firm. If the letters produced by Baker's machines are similar to the FB/B, they are very distinctive.

Has any member any type of material (cheques, postcards, revenue statements, accounts, stamps etc) perforated with these many holed letters or any other relevant information?

The Postage Stamp Press illustrated is similar to the perforating machine which BRIAN MERRYWEATHER brought to the May meeting at Baden Powell House. This machine however perforated documents for one of London's Cemeteries.

1st W.W. Prisoner of War Card.

The photocopy of this most unusual card caused some raised eyebrows when I showed it to some collectors of German Postal History. It is thanks to ARTHUR SMITH that this item came to my notice.

The printing on the card speaks for itself but the perforation:- Gepuft/K.G.L.Chemitz stands for "Censored/P.O.W.Camp Chemnitz"
