

The items on the next page confuse me. The user of perfin pattern A221-36 in *The Catalog of United States Perfins* is listed as the American Radiator Company of Detroit, MI. However, I found this pattern on a cover with a Philadelphia address. The cover also lists American Radiator and Standard Sanitary Corporation. Is this the merger that created American Standard? The matter is further complicated by the second cover which uses perfin design #43. That design has the Standard Sanitary Corporation of Pittsburgh listed as the user. But, the cover's corner card lists American Radiator and Standard Sanitary Corporation of Pittsburgh, PA.
