<u>GUINESS BREWERY</u> From Rosemary Smith


This would seem to be as good a place as any to include this information which 1 cut from the Daily Mail earlier this year.

Guiness will no longer be brewed in Britain from next summer. The plant which has made the stout for nearly 70 years is to close. Guiness for British drinkers will be produced instead at the Dublin brewery where founder Arthur Guiness first made his stout in 1759.

The Dublin plant - one of 50 brewing locations worldwide - makes eight million kegs a year for markets including Europe and the US. Some 90 jobs will be lost when the **PARK ROYAL** brewery in North-West London closes.

5 perfins are associated with Guiness Breweries - the earliest being $A.G.S/\&C^{\circ}$ (A2625.01) in 1870 at their St James's Gate Brewery, Dublin. The latest AG/S (A2610.01 M) 1959-1990.



My covers for A2610.01M, have the legend "Arthur Guiness Son & Co. (Park Royal) Ltd" on the back of the covers. These are dated 1959 but posted in Manchester.

However, the perfins "PR" (P3760.01 - .05a) are mostly identified as coming from companies with works at Park Royal, London NW10. So from the newspaper cutting it would seem that Arthur Guiness Brewery was also at the same location.
