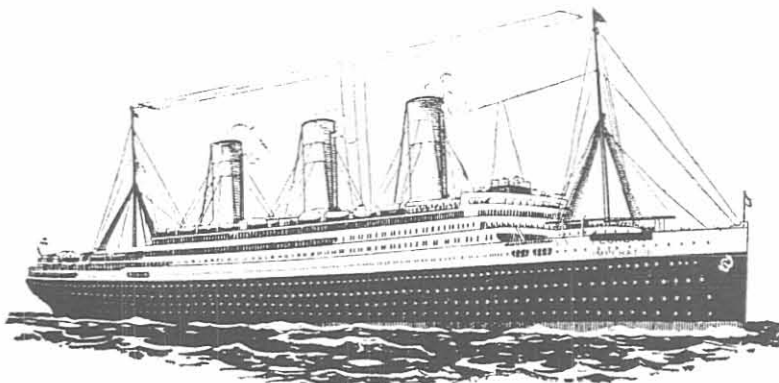


H18 - Hamburg-American Line

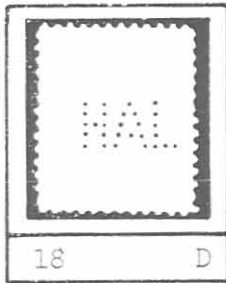
