
Both of these gentlemen have agreed that the machines will only be used on stamps currently available in the post office and on future issues. They will never perforate older or used stamps for themselves or anyone else. This will keep the integrity of the perfin used by the previous owners.

Dick indicates that all perfins made by his perforator will be from the front of the stamps with the face up. No other positions will be available.



Two perforating devices will come back into use this year. The machines formerly owned and used by the late club treasurer, Jack A. Gooding and the late club secretary, John Needham are once again in use. The Reverend John A. Griswold (#2411) was fortunate to have the same initials as Jack Gooding and he can use the device without any changes.

The second machine, that of John Needham, depicting the wheelchair symbol of the handicapped, will be used by immediate past president Dick Mewinney (LM60). Although not physically handicapped with the need of a wheelchair, Dick does have handicapped license plates for his vehicle.
