equipment which not only places an envelope in the proper position to cancel the stamp but which also scuffs the stamp. Having been stacked incorrectly it was postmarked on the bottom left at 3 pm October 5, 1918, and at the correct location at $4: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ on the same day. The stamp is punched with perfin pattern B12.6. The single code hole on the lowerleft of the letter "B" enclosed in a diamond would be hard to miss.
