TO PREVENT THEFT



Land Title and Trust Co. Philadelphia, Pa. Joseph Sloper applied for and was granted a patent in 1868 to perforate stamps which would identify their users. Sloper devised this method of identification to prevent pilferage an misuse of a company's postage. Early records of the Sloper Company were destroyed during the bombings of London in World War II, therefore, it is not known who was the the first company to utilize Sloper's patent.


DEVELOPMENT OF THE PERFIN OF BOUSTEAD AND COMPANY FROM THE STRAIT SETTLEMENTS

TO PREVENT THEFT

Boustead and Company was forwarding agent as early as 1843, with offices in Singapore and Penang. With diverse interests in importing, exporting and insurance, Boustead and Company was the largest user of postage stamps in the area. Control of their postal material was needed to prevent the removal and reuse by low paid coolies, wallas and clerks.





In 1865, Thomas Cook started booking trips throughout Europe and a year later to the United States. Gradually, Thomas Cook & Son expanded its organization throughout the world.








PERFINNED POSTAL STATIONARY OF AUSTRIA AND DENMARK

TO PREVENT THEFT

The use of perfins on postal stationery is rather unusual. The first use of the perfin on postal stationary is unknown. However, Joseph Sloper's patent was utilized initially, but later other companies perfin machines were used.



Austria 1880- Joseph sloper perfin on postal card. Sloper's design are characterized by careful spacing of the letters to attempt not to deface the Emporor's face. Note also the flat headed ampersand.



Denmark 1888- Monogrammed perfin design of H. B. Cohn (HBC).
