what has come into my hands.
Figure 1 represents an on cover usage of a "B" rate stamp (198). Since the present catalog lists neither a user nor a location, this cover may represent a beginning. While the corner card lists the Occidental Life Insurance Company's branch office located in the First National Bank Building in Boise, Idaho the two CDSs provide conflicting data. The lighter one lists "BOISE/MAR 11/1930/7 PM/IDAHO" and the heavier one lists "THE DALES/ MAR 15/11:30 AM/1930/ORE." From this it appears that the "The Dales" receiving mark hit the wrong side of the envelope. In any event, the corner card's Occidental Life Insurance as a user does not match the pattern's "ISL". But, at least the Boise, Idaho location and the first cancellation from Boise seem like good possibilities. Maybe someone else can help with this mystery while this information is passed on to the catalog editor for review.
