

## New Jersey Zinc Company - N98-N100

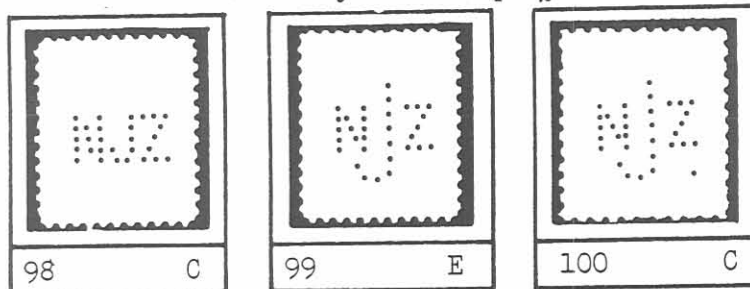


Figure 1 Perfins used by the New Jersey Zinc Company

The confirmed user of perfin patterns N98 through N100 is the New Jersey Zinc Company. The patterns are listed in *The Catalog of United States Perfins* as being used in the following locations:

N98 Chicago, IL

N99 New York, NY - Note 1

N100 Palmerton, PA - Note 2

Note 2 Original listing of "Pemberton, PA" was corrected to "Palmerton, PA" by A&C

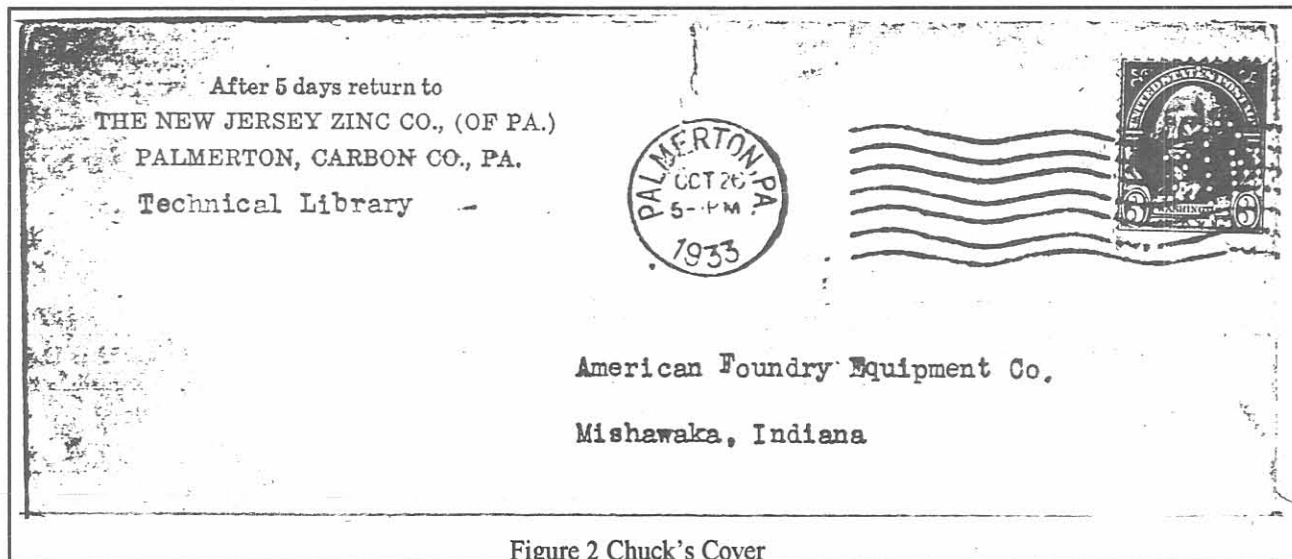


Figure 2 Chuck's Cover

Chuck's New Jersey Zinc Company's cover shown in Figure 2 got us to thinking

about several incongruities

among the catalog listings and the company's name. The cover using a stamp punched with pattern N99 (no control hole under the letter Z) provides us with the return address of Palmerton, Carbon County, Pennsylvania. The incongruities are:

- 1 To date no one has reported a cover from a city in New Jersey.
- 2 Is pattern N99 simply pattern N100 with the control hole pin broken? See US Catalog Editor's comments below.
- 3 The supplemental listing in the current catalog for pattern N99 is incor-

ect. The city name is Palmerton and Figure 2 shows a much earlier usage (1933) than the 1946 listed in Note 1 above.

A full-sized photocopy was forwarded to the US Catalog Editor with the recommendation that the catalog should be corrected as noted above.

The US Catalog Editor provided the following comment:

The company's name will be corrected. Number 100 is almost certainly not N100 with a broken control pin. N99 is known earlier than N100.
