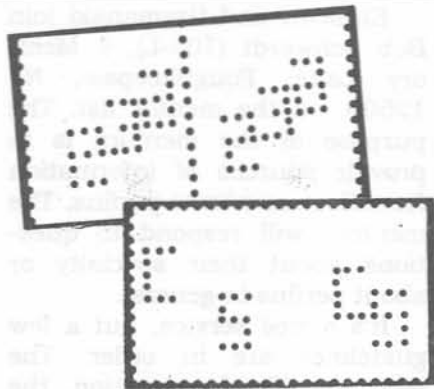

Old personal perfin gets a second chance

Shuck perfin reworked into Spaulding perfin

Some people get married in June. Chuck Spaulding is celebrating the month by issuing his own perfin. Actually Spaulding has two new perfins, although they are permanently linked.

The Spaulding perfin(s) is not totally new. It's a rework of the GES (G75.5P) pattern of the late George E. Shuck.

Steve Grabowski (#3409) did the modification work for Spaulding. The perforator is a two-headed device and both designs fit on a large commemorative stamp or on adjoining regular stamps.



The pairing of patterns is similar to the HAR/RIS pattern of the late Jim Harris.

Spaulding says he will perforate current U.S. stamps with

his perfin for members. You must supply either a large commemorative or connected regular or coil issues. Only current stamps will be perforated.
