

MAILER'S POSTMARK PERMITS



On May 1, 1971 the Sarasota Philatelic Club introduced two new features for Club mailings.

In addition to the Mailer's Precancel Postmark Permit, the 6c stamp bears a perfin (perforated design) cancelation. The reverse side of a coil pair is reproduced here to show the perfin. Dietrich Riemer, the Club president, was responsible for the perfin design, as well as for the Mailer's Precancel Postmark and the special cachet used on the February 22 mailing.



The return-address cachet on the envelope, shown at the lower left, carries not only the usual necessary information but also a reproduction of the United States Circus stamp (Scott No. 1309) which so aptly characterizes Sarasota. Mrs. Dietrich Riemer was responsible for both the design and the art work on the cachet.

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
