



Note: This suspected identity replaces the suspected identity in both 'Gault' and 'Tomkins', which falls short as the company didn't survive into the Edwardian period - die in use 1875-1908.

There is a Joseph Singleton, Chemist, in business in Birmingham in the 1820s, as his partnership with Anderson Ashmore (the younger) was dissolved 13th October 1824. There is also a Joseph Singleton, manufacturing chemist (Eyre St), and vinegar manufacturer (Icknield St West), mentioned in an 1849 Birmingham trade directory. Joseph Singleton was in partnership with John Benz Winder (1823-1908) but the partnership was dissolved. However, the trading name continued as 'Joseph Singleton & Co', with the company being run by John Benz Winder (a true 'Brummie' as he was born in Birmingham 17th October 1823). The company appears to have ceased when John Benz Winder died 18th December 1908. Note that in the 1851 UK Census, Joseph Singleton, aged 55, was a Chemist & Vinegar Maker living in Goode St, Birmingham. This must be 'our' man, although he is known to have died 3rd June 1865.
