Frank cannot find it in his Kellys'. Can anyone identify the user from these clues?

NORMAN HEVERDINE has loaned me the illustrated letterhead, seen on the next page, which was part of a receipted letter. The receipt stamp is a 1d lilac perfined I.O/C° (11926.01). There seems to be no connection with the company although the stamp is over stamped with the name of 'The New York Belting and Packing Co. Ltd! The illustration of letter head and 1d lilac are reduced in

size but the die illustration is actual size. Has anyone any ideas? Someone from the Perfins Club may have an American cover from this company which may give the answer.
