GLYN PERFIN.

HAKRY DOBSON writes to ask if his recent acquisition of a 'GLYN' perfin (Tomkins 3260.01) on an 1873 cover is the earliest known? He also points out that the Tomkins' Catalogue gives the identity as Glyn Mills & Co., London EC, (as does Tilles) yet his letter is embossed 'Glyn Mills Currie S Co. (I too (M.R.S.) have an entire with this perfin on a Id plate dated 25 Jan '79 and my logo says the same, with address of 67 Lombard Street.) Is the Currie the same D. Currie of Edwards' Catalogue C7980.01,02 & 03? If so, when did they split from Glyn Mills & Co? (All my CURRIE) perfins are on 1d lilacs) Has anyone a potted history of Glyn's bank?
